ORDER OF BUSINESS: Public sessions of all Regular Meetings of the City Council / Community Development Commission - Housing Authority (hereafter referred to as Elected Body) begin at 6:00 p.m. on the first and third Tuesday of each month. Public Hearings begin at 6:00 p.m. unless otherwise noted. Closed Meetings begin in Open Session at 5:00 p.m. or such other time as noted, and after announcing closed session items, convenes into a Closed Meeting. If a workshop is scheduled, the subject and time of the workshop will appear on the agenda. The Mayor and Council members also sit as the Chairperson and Members of the Board of the Community Development Commission (CDC).

REPORTS: All open session agenda items and reports as well as all documents and writings distributed to the Elected Body less than 72 hours prior to the meeting, are available for review at the entry to the Council Chambers. Regular Meetings of the Elected Body are webcast and archived on the City's website **www.nationalcityca.gov**.

PUBLIC COMMENTS: Prior to the Business portion of the agenda, the Elected Body will receive public comments regarding any matters within the jurisdiction of the City and/or the Community Development Commission. Members of the public may also address any item on the agenda at the time the item is considered by the Elected Body. Persons who wish to address the Elected Body are requested to fill out a "Request to Speak" form available at the entrance to the City Council Chambers, and turn in the completed form to the City Clerk. The Mayor or Chairperson will separately call for testimony of those persons who have turned in a "Request to Speak" form. If you wish to speak, please step to the podium at the appropriate time and state your name and address (optional) for the record. The time limit established for public testimony is three minutes per speaker unless a different time limit is announced. Speakers are encouraged to be brief. The Mayor or Chairperson may limit the length of comments due to the number of persons wishing to speak or if comments become repetitious or irrelevant.

WRITTEN AGENDA: With limited exceptions, the Elected Body may take action only upon items appearing on the written agenda. Items not appearing on the agenda must be brought back on a subsequent agenda unless they are of a demonstrated emergency or urgent nature, and the need to take action on such items arose after the agenda was posted.

CONSENT CALENDAR: Consent calendar items involve matters which are of a routine or noncontroversial nature. All consent items are

adopted by approval of a single motion by the City Council. Prior to such approval, any item may be removed from the consent portion of the agenda and separately considered upon request of a Councilmember, a staff member, or a member of the public.

Upon request, this agenda can be made available in appropriate alternative formats to persons with a disability in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act. Please contact the City Clerk's Office at (619) 336-4228 to request a disability-related modification or accommodation. Notification 24-hours prior to the meeting will enable the City to make reasonable arrangements to ensure accessibility to this meeting.

EXPLANATION

In April 2015, the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) adopted an Amendment to the Water Quality Control Plan for Ocean Waters of California as well as the Water Quality Control Plan for Inland Surface Waters, Enclosed Bays, and Estuaries – collectively referred to as the “Trash Amendments.” Broadly, the “Trash Amendments” require significant new efforts to reduce discharges of trash from storm drain systems for all municipal agencies in the San Diego region.

The San Diego Regional Water Quality Control Board (Regional Water Board) has issued Investigative Order R9-2017-0077 (“Trash IO”) which requires the City of National City and other municipal agencies in the San Diego region to prepare and submit plans that explain how they will comply with the “Trash Amendments.” The agencies will be required to start implementing the trash control activities described in their plans after the requirements of the “Trash Amendments” are incorporated into the forthcoming reissued San Diego region municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4) permit (Municipal Permit). The Municipal Permit is expected to be reissued in Summer/Fall 2019.

Staff has prepared a presentation to inform City Council and the public of these new requirements, staff’s plan for ensuring compliance, and timeline for approval and implementation. While some new trash control efforts will be needed, including installing structural devices to filter out trash from storm drains in targeted areas, the plan proposes to take full credit for existing trash control programs. These efforts include street sweeping, storm drain and channel cleaning, maintaining trash bins in parks and along streets with higher pedestrian traffic, existing storm water treatment systems installed by National City through the Capital Improvement Program and by private development, cleanup events, and public education.

The draft implementation plan was submitted to the Regional Water Board for review on December 3, 2018. Board comments on the draft plan are anticipated in early 2019. After addressing comments received from the Board, staff will present the plan to City Council along with a discussion on possible funding options for implementation and maintenance costs. It is expected that program implementation will begin in fiscal year 2019-2020, with a 10 year phase-in period for full implementation.

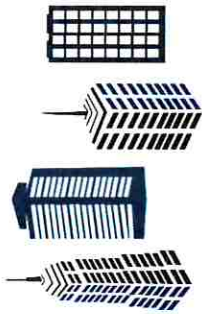

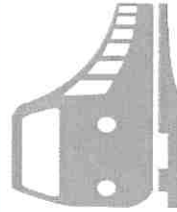

Two Compliance Options

Track 1

- Install **Full Capture Systems** (“Trash Filters”) for all Priority Land Uses
- No credit for any other activities that remove trash

- Must show “equivalency” to Track 1 trash removal
- Install some Trash Filters in targeted areas

It is an organization for the improvement of police and community relations and the facilitation of disputes whenever possible. It provides a forum for citizens to voice their concerns, comment about police conduct, practices and policies and improves communication between citizens and the National City Police Department

The National City Community and Police Relations Commission is empowered to receive and review complaints regarding National City Police Department Personnel for alleged misconduct, and to recommend appropriate changes of Police Department policies and procedures toward the goals of safeguarding the rights of persons and promoting higher standards of competency, efficiency and justice in the provision of community policing services.

Applicants must be completely forthright and truthful during the application process. Applicants may be disqualified in the background process as a result of dishonesty and/or purposely omitting information regarding one's criminal history. Given the complexity of this Commission and its duties, it is necessary to pass a criminal background check prior to appointment by City Council and/or swearing in as Commissioner. 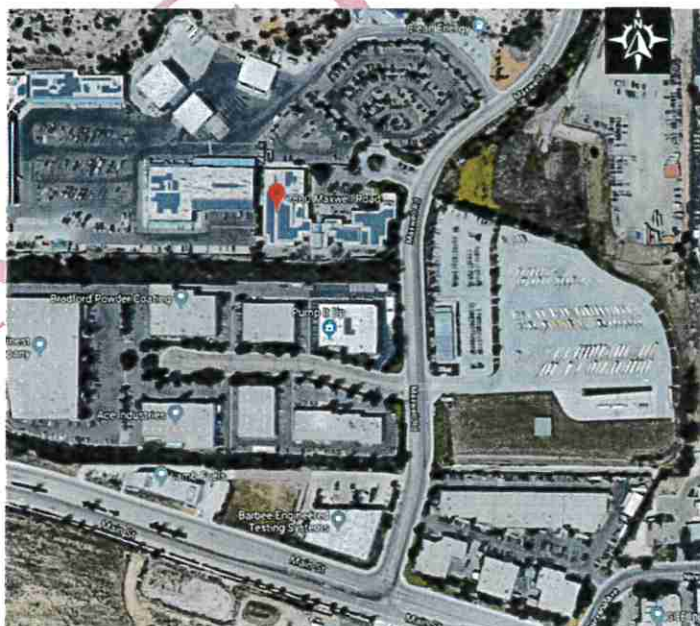

The current 1999 Ford F-450 used by the City Public Works Streets Division has exceeded its useful life and is scheduled to be replaced. Staff desires to purchase a new 2019 Ford Super Duty F-450 DRW (X4G) XL 2WD SuperCab. Consistent with Section 2.60.260 of the National City Municipal Code (NCMC) regarding cooperative purchasing, there is an opportunity to piggyback onto the Sourcewell Contract #120716-NAF with National Auto Fleet Group to allow for the purchase of one 2019 Ford Super Duty F-450 DRW (X4G) XL 2WD SuperCab.

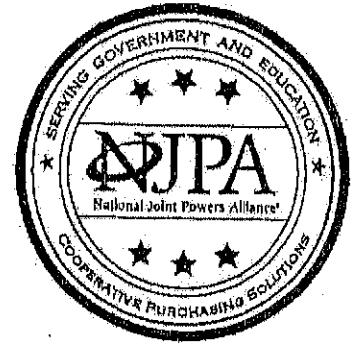

EXPLANATION

Mr. Jose Hernandez and Mrs. Rafaela Hernandez, residents of 704 "E" Avenue, have requested a blue curb disabled persons parking space in front of their residence. The residents possess a valid disabled persons placard from the California Department of Motor Vehicles. Mr. Hernandez stated that it is difficult for him to find parking near his property due to the high demand of parking in this area. Mr. Hernandez also stated that his property possesses an unpaved driveway with no garage, and that a disabled persons parking space in front of his house would provide easier access to the house for him.

Staff visited the site and confirmed that Mr. Hernandez's residence has an unpaved driveway with no garage. The unpaved driveway cannot accommodate a vehicle with a disabled driver or passenger.

The City Council has adopted a policy which is used to evaluate requests for disabled persons parking spaces. The City Council Disabled Persons Parking Policy requirements for "Special Hardship" cases are as follows:

1. Applicant (or guardian) must be in possession of valid license plates or placard for "disabled persons" or "disabled veterans". *This condition is met.*
2. The proposed disabled parking space must be in front (or side if on a corner lot) of the applicant's (or guardian's) place of residence. *This condition is met.*
3. The residence must not have useable off-street parking available or an off-street space available that may be converted into disabled parking. *This condition is met.*

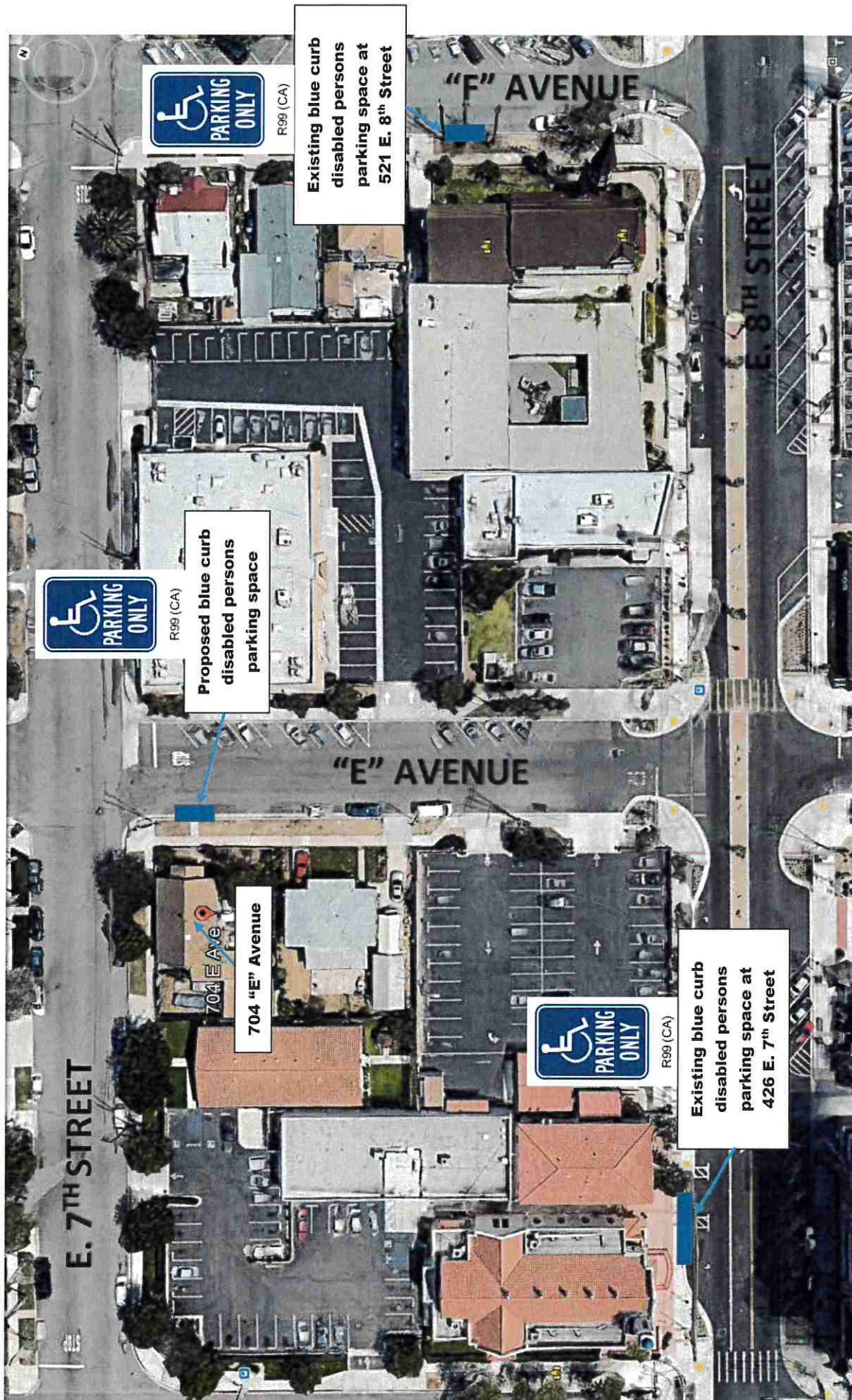
Since all three conditions of the City Council Disabled Persons Parking Policy for "Special Hardship" cases are met, staff recommended the installation of a blue curb disabled persons parking space with signage at 704 "E" Avenue.

This item was presented to the Traffic Safety Committee (TSC) on November 14, 2018. Mr. and Mrs. Hernandez were in attendance spoke in support of the blue curb disabled persons parking space.

The Traffic Safety Committee voted unanimously to approve the installation of a blue curb disabled persons parking space with signage in front of the residence at 704 "E" Avenue. The applicant was informed that handicap parking spaces do not constitute "personal reserved parking" and that any person with valid "disabled persons" license plates or placards may park in handicap spaces.

DISCUSSION:

Mr. Jose Hernandez and Mrs. Rafaela Hernandez, residents of 704 E Avenue, have requested a blue curb disabled persons parking space in front of their residence. The residents possess a valid disabled persons placard from the California Department of Motor Vehicles. Mr. Hernandez stated that it is difficult for him to find parking near his property due to the high demand of parking in this area. Mr. Hernandez also stated that his property possesses an unpaved driveway with no garage, and that a disabled persons parking space in front of his house would provide easier access to the house for him.

Staff visited the site and confirmed that Mr. Hernandez's residence has a driveway and no garage. With his permission and supervision, staff observed that the existing driveway of the property is not paved, and therefore cannot accommodate a vehicle with a disabled driver or passenger. This condition is not met since the property does not possess off-street parking that could be converted into a disabled parking space.

The City Council has adopted a policy which is used to evaluate requests for disabled persons parking spaces. The City Council Disabled Persons Parking Policy requirements for "Special Hardship" cases are as follows:

1. Applicant (or guardian) must be in possession of valid license plates or placard for "disabled persons" or "disabled veterans". *This condition is met.*
2. The proposed disabled parking space must be in front (or side if on a corner lot) of the applicant's (or guardian's) place of residence. *This condition is met.*
3. The residence must not have useable off-street parking available or an off-street space available that may be converted into disabled parking. *This condition is met.*

It shall be noted that disabled persons parking spaces do not constitute "personal reserved parking" and that any person with valid "disabled persons" license plates or placards may park in handicap spaces.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Since all three conditions of the City Council Disabled Persons Parking Policy for "Special Hardship" cases are met, staff recommends the installation of a blue curb disabled persons parking space with signage in front of the residence at 704 E Avenue.

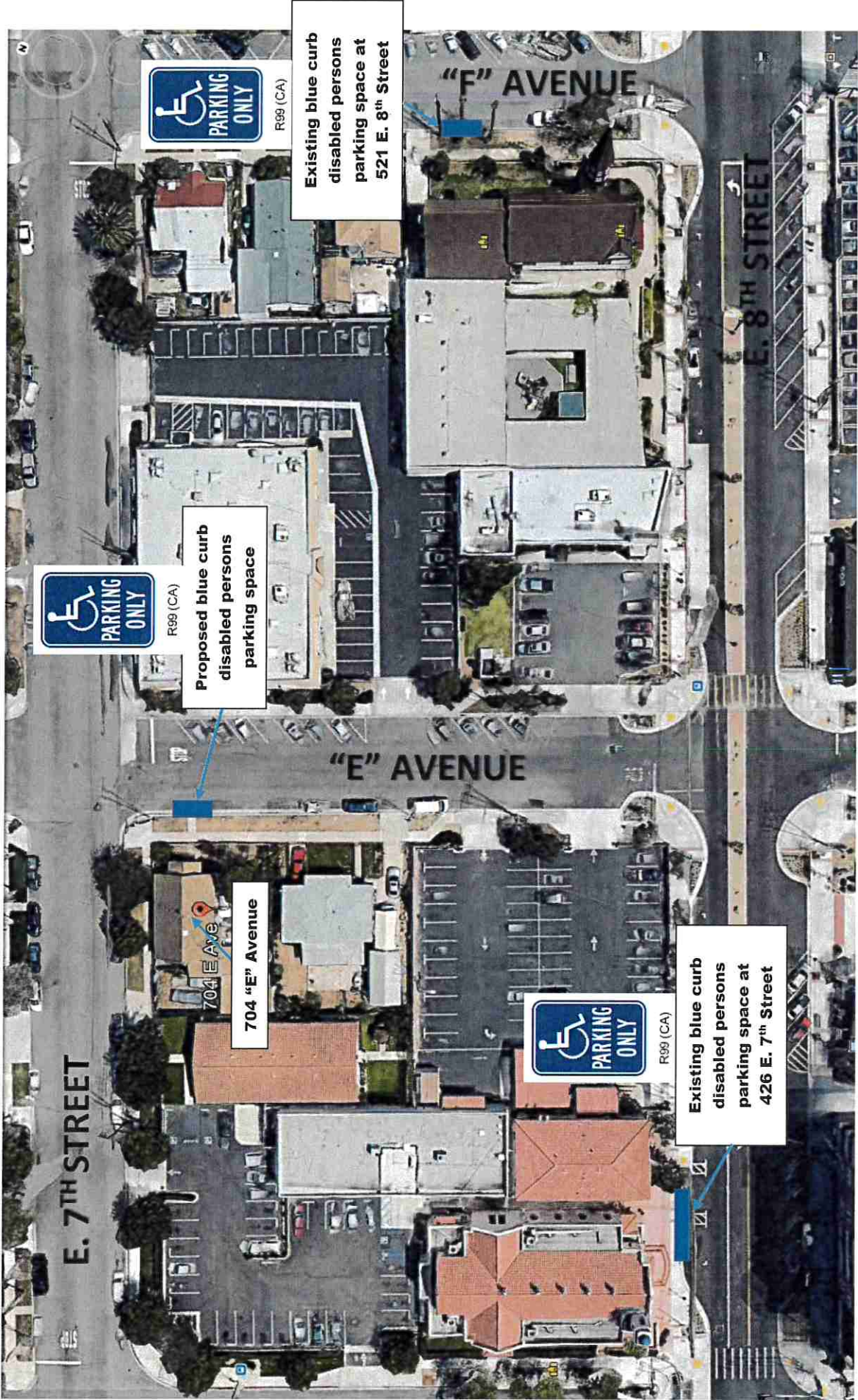

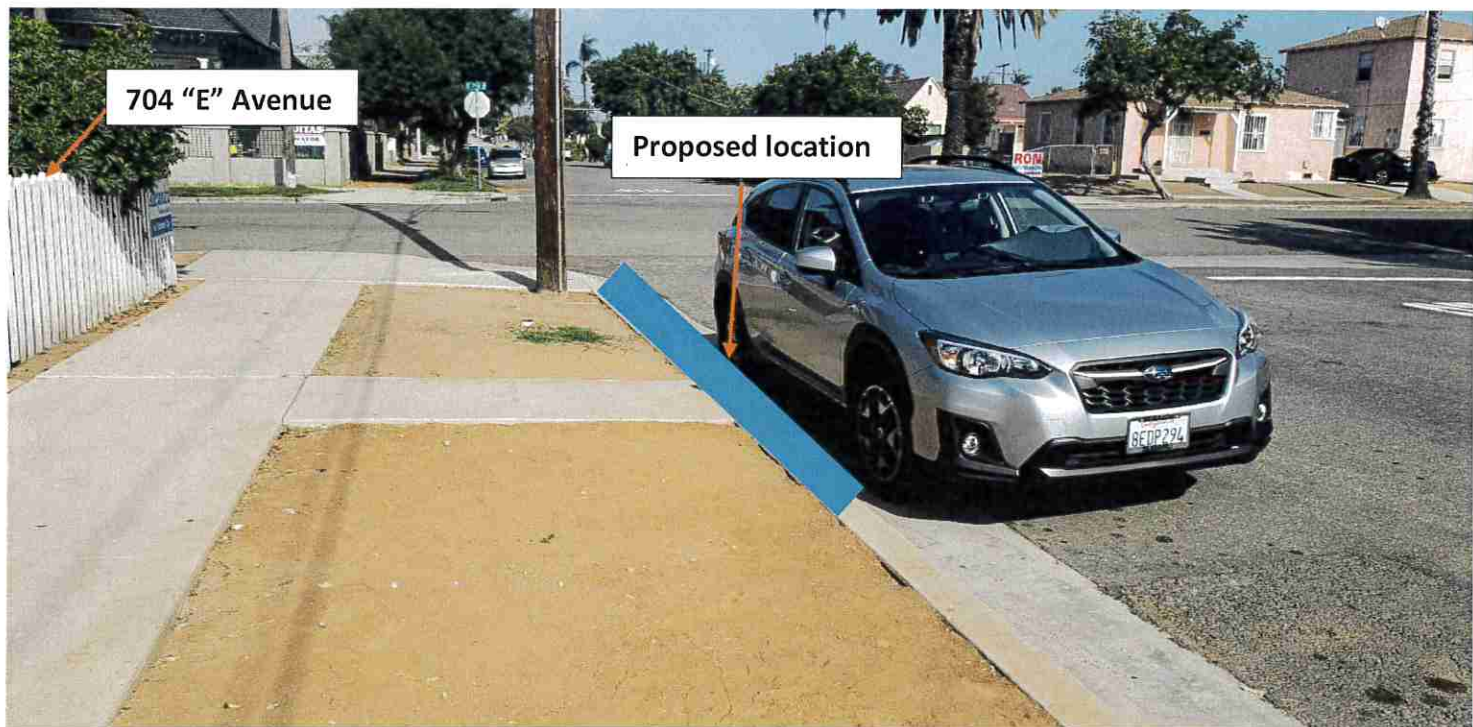

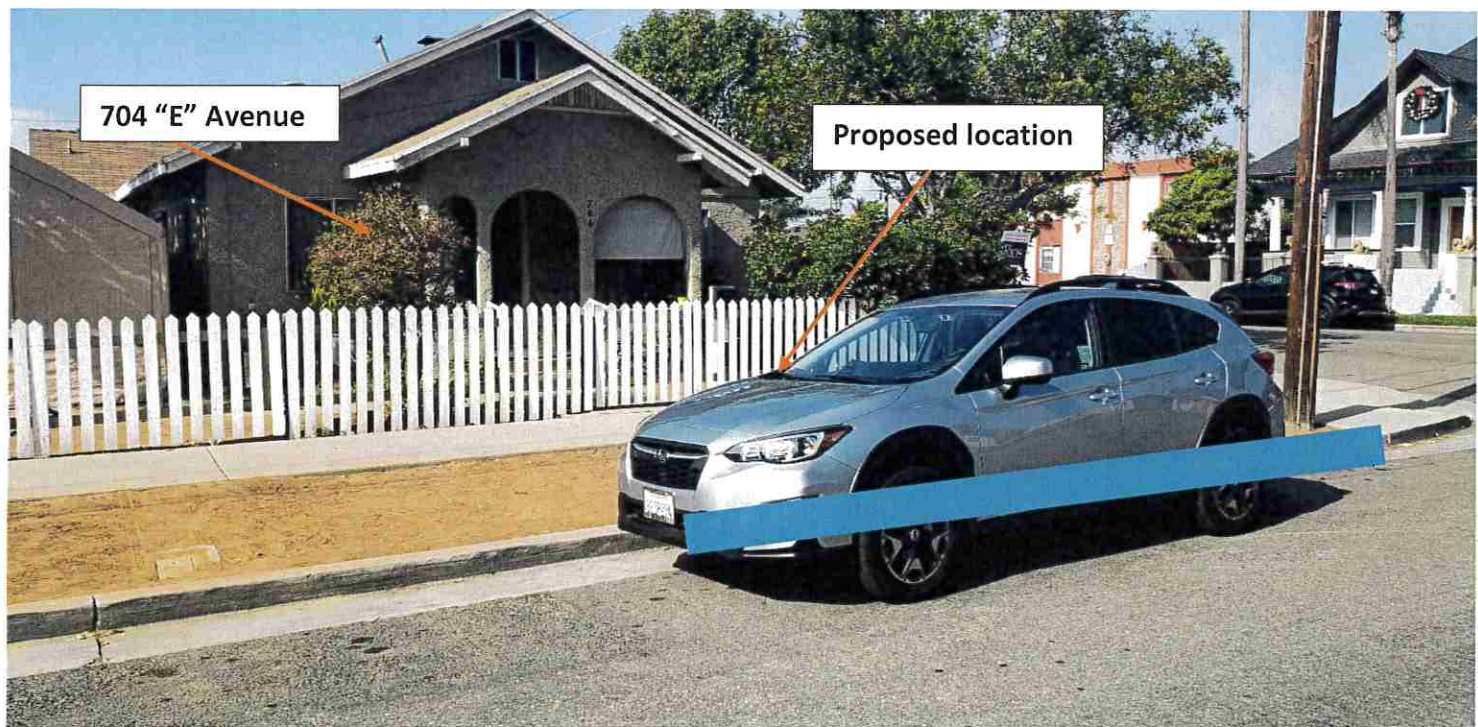

DISABLED PERSONS PARKING POLICY

The purpose of a disabled persons parking zone is to provide designated parking spaces at major points of assembly for the exclusive use of physically disabled persons whose vehicle displays a distinguishing license plate as authorized by the California Department of Motor Vehicles.

The City Council may upon recommendation of the City Engineer, designate specially marked and posted on-street parking spaces for disabled persons pursuant to California Vehicle Code 21101, et seq. at the following facilities:

1. Government buildings serving the public such as administration buildings, public employment offices, public libraries, police stations, etc.
2. Hospitals and convalescent homes with more than 75-bed capacity.
3. Medical facilities and doctors' offices staffed by a maximum of five practitioners. Zones shall be located to serve a maximum number of facilities on one block.
4. Community service facilities such as senior citizens service centers, etc.
5. Accredited vocational training and educational facilities where no off-street parking is provided for disabled persons.
6. Employment offices for major enterprises employing more than 200 persons.
7. Public recreational facilities including municipal swimming pools, recreation halls, museums, etc.
8. Public theaters, auditoriums, meeting halls, arenas, stadiums with more than 300 seating capacity.
9. Other places of assembly such as schools and churches.
10. Commercial and/or office building(s) with an aggregate of more than 50,000 square feet of usable floor space. Zone shall be located to serve a maximum number of facilities on one block.
11. Hotels catering to daily guests, maintaining a ground floor lobby and a switchboard that is operated 24 hours per day.

12. A hotel or apartment house catering to weekly or monthly guests and containing more than 30 separate living units.

In addition, disabled persons parking spaces may be provided within all publicly owned, leased or controlled off-street parking facilities as specified in the General Requirements.

General Requirements

Each disabled persons parking space shall be indicated by blue paint and a sign (white on blue) showing the international symbol of accessibility (a profile view of a wheelchair with occupant).

Where installed under the above criteria the total number of disabled persons curb parking spaces will be limited to 3% of the total number of on-street parking spaces available in the area and shall be distributed uniformly within the area.

Disabled persons parking will not be installed at locations with a full-time parking prohibition. When a disabled persons parking zone is installed where a part-time parking prohibition is in effect, the disabled persons parking zone will have the same time restrictions as the part-time parking prohibition.

The cost of installing disabled persons parking will be assumed by the City on public streets and public off-street parking facilities.

In establishing on-street parking facilities for the disabled there shall be a reasonable determination made that the need is of an on-going nature. The intent is to prevent the proliferation of special parking stalls that may be installed for a short-term purpose but later are seldom used. Unjustified installation of such parking stalls unnecessarily increases the City's maintenance and operations costs, reduce available on-street parking for the general public, and detract from the overall effectiveness of the disabled persons parking program.

Special Hardship Cases

It is not the intention of the City to provide personal reserved parking on the public right-of-way, especially in residential areas. However, exceptions may be made, in special hardship cases, provided all of the following conditions exists:

- (1) Applicant (or guardian) must be in possession of valid license plates for "disabled persons" or "disabled veterans."
- (2) The proposed disabled parking space must be in front of the applicant's (or guardian's) place of residence.

- (3) Subject residence must not have useable off-street parking available or off-street space available that may be converted into disabled parking.

NOTE: It must be emphasized that such parking spaces do not constitute "personal reserved parking" and that any person with valid "disabled persons" license plates may park in the above stalls.

EXPLANATION

Ms. Minerva Beltran, resident of 2132 "B" Avenue, has requested a blue curb disabled persons parking space in front of her residence. The resident possesses a valid disabled persons placard from the California Department of Motor Vehicles. Ms. Beltran stated that it is difficult for her to find parking in front of her residence and that a disabled persons parking space in front her residence would provide easier access to the house.

Staff visited the site and observed that Ms. Beltran's residence does have a garage and a driveway. The driveway is too small to accommodate a vehicle with a disabled driver or passenger. Staff measured the slope of the driveway, which is approximately 6%. Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) guidelines require a cross-slope of no more than 2%. Therefore, the driveway cannot accommodate a vehicle with a disabled driver or passenger.

The City Council has adopted a policy which is used to evaluate requests for disabled persons parking spaces. The City Council Disabled Persons Parking Policy requirements for "Special Hardship" cases are as follows:

1. Applicant (or guardian) must be in possession of valid license plates or placard for "disabled persons" or "disabled veterans". *This condition is met.*
2. The proposed disabled parking space must be in front (or side if on a corner lot) of the applicant's (or guardian's) place of residence. *This condition is met.*
3. The residence must not have useable off-street parking available or an off-street space available that may be converted into disabled parking. *This condition is met.*

Since all three conditions of the City Council Disabled Persons Parking Policy for "Special Hardship" cases are met, staff recommended the installation of a blue curb disabled persons parking space with signage at 2132 "B" Avenue.

This item was presented to the Traffic Safety Committee (TSC) on November 14, 2018. No one was in attendance to speak in support of the blue curb disabled persons parking space.

The Traffic Safety Committee voted unanimously to approve the installation of a blue curb disabled persons parking space with signage in front of the residence at 2132 "B" Avenue.

The applicant was informed that handicap parking spaces do not constitute "personal reserved parking" and that any person with valid "disabled persons" license plates or placards may park in handicap spaces.

If approved by City Council, all work will be performed by City Public Works.

DISCUSSION:

Ms. Minerva Beltran, resident of 2132 "B" Avenue, has requested a blue curb disabled persons parking space in front of her residence. The resident possesses a valid disabled persons placard from the California Department of Motor Vehicles. Ms. Beltran stated that it is difficult for her to find parking in front of her residence. Ms. Beltran currently rents the property on 2132 "B" Avenue. However, the property owner has not provided access to off-street parking and Ms. Beltran stated that a disabled persons parking space in front her residence would provide easier access to the house.

Staff visited the site and observed that Ms. Beltran's residence does have a garage and a driveway in the property being occupied with the property owner's vehicles with no available access for Ms. Beltran's vehicle.

The City Council has adopted a policy which is used to evaluate requests for disabled persons parking spaces. The City Council Disabled Persons Parking Policy requirements for "Special Hardship" cases are as follows:

1. Applicant (or guardian) must be in possession of valid license plates or placard for "disabled persons" or "disabled veterans". *This condition is met.*
2. The proposed disabled parking space must be in front (or side if on a corner lot) of the applicant's (or guardian's) place of residence. *This condition is met.*
3. The residence must not have useable off-street parking available or an off-street space available that may be converted into disabled parking. *This condition is met.*

It shall be noted that disabled persons parking spaces do not constitute "personal reserved parking" and that any person with valid "disabled persons" license plates or placards may park in handicap spaces.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Since all three conditions of the City Council Disabled Persons Parking Policy for "Special Hardship" cases are met, staff recommends the installation of a blue curb disabled persons parking space with signage in front of the residence at 2132 "B" Avenue.

DISABLED PERSONS PARKING POLICY

The purpose of a disabled persons parking zone is to provide designated parking spaces at major points of assembly for the exclusive use of physically disabled persons whose vehicle displays a distinguishing license plate as authorized by the California Department of Motor Vehicles.

The City Council may upon recommendation of the City Engineer, designate specially marked and posted on-street parking spaces for disabled persons pursuant to California Vehicle Code 21101, et seq. at the following facilities:

1. Government buildings serving the public such as administration buildings, public employment offices, public libraries, police stations, etc.
2. Hospitals and convalescent homes with more than 75-bed capacity.
3. Medical facilities and doctors' offices staffed by a maximum of five practitioners. Zones shall be located to serve a maximum number of facilities on one block.
4. Community service facilities such as senior citizens service centers, etc.
5. Accredited vocational training and educational facilities where no off-street parking is provided for disabled persons.
6. Employment offices for major enterprises employing more than 200 persons.
7. Public recreational facilities including municipal swimming pools, recreation halls, museums, etc.
8. Public theaters, auditoriums, meeting halls, arenas, stadiums with more than 300 seating capacity.
9. Other places of assembly such as schools and churches.
10. Commercial and/or office building(s) with an aggregate of more than 50,000 square feet of usable floor space. Zone shall be located to serve a maximum number of facilities on one block.
11. Hotels catering to daily guests, maintaining a ground floor lobby and a switchboard that is operated 24 hours per day.

12. A hotel or apartment house catering to weekly or monthly guests and containing more than 30 separate living units.

In addition, disabled persons parking spaces may be provided within all publicly owned, leased or controlled off-street parking facilities as specified in the General Requirements.

General Requirements

Each disabled persons parking space shall be indicated by blue paint and a sign (white on blue) showing the international symbol of accessibility (a profile view of a wheelchair with occupant).

Where installed under the above criteria the total number of disabled persons curb parking spaces will be limited to 3% of the total number of on-street parking spaces available in the area and shall be distributed uniformly within the area.

Disabled persons parking will not be installed at locations with a full-time parking prohibition. When a disabled persons parking zone is installed where a part-time parking prohibition is in effect, the disabled persons parking zone will have the same time restrictions as the part-time parking prohibition.

The cost of installing disabled persons parking will be assumed by the City on public streets and public off-street parking facilities.

In establishing on-street parking facilities for the disabled there shall be a reasonable determination made that the need is of an on-going nature. The intent is to prevent the proliferation of special parking stalls that may be installed for a short-term purpose but later are seldom used. Unjustified installation of such parking stalls unnecessarily increases the City's maintenance and operations costs, reduce available on-street parking for the general public, and detract from the overall effectiveness of the disabled persons parking program.

Special Hardship Cases

It is not the intention of the City to provide personal reserved parking on the public right-of-way, especially in residential areas. However, exceptions may be made, in special hardship cases, provided all of the following conditions exists:

- (1) Applicant (or guardian) must be in possession of valid license plates for "disabled persons" or "disabled veterans."
- (2) The proposed disabled parking space must be in front of the applicant's (or guardian's) place of residence.

- (3) Subject residence must not have useable off-street parking available or off-street space available that may be converted into disabled parking.

NOTE: It must be emphasized that such parking spaces do not constitute "personal reserved parking" and that any person with valid "disabled persons" license plates may park in the above stalls.

EXPLANATION

Mr. Heriberto Gutierrez, owner of "Tortilleria El Grano de Oro" (Tortilleria), located at 730 E. 7th Street has requested time restricted parking on E. 7th Street in front of the Tortilleria in order to increase parking turnover for customers. Mr. Gutierrez stated that the customers are unable to find on-street parking easily and drive out of the area in order to find available parking. Furthermore, Mr. Gutierrez stated that parking spaces in front of his business are frequently occupied by vehicles all day. According to Mr. Gutierrez, the conversion from unrestricted parking to "15-minute" parking will provide customers ample time to shop at the Tortilleria and increase parking turnover for customers.

Staff visited the site and confirmed that the Tortilleria is located on the south side of E. 7th Street, west of Highland Avenue. The Tortilleria is part of a commercial building located at the southwest corner of Highland Avenue and E. 7th Street. The building includes a parking lot with ten parking spaces, including one disabled parking space. E. 7th Street is a 2-lane local roadway with on-street parking on both side of the street and a posted speed limit of 25 mph. In front of the Tortilleria there is approximately 72 feet of unrestricted parallel parking, which provides parking for up to three vehicles.

This item was presented to the Traffic Safety Committee on November 14, 2018. Mr. Heriberto Gutierrez was in attendance and spoke in support of the item. Mr. Gutierrez confirmed the above statements. Mr. Gutierrez also stated that the parking lot of the commercial building is always occupied by employees and customers of the businesses located adjacent to the parking lot and since the Tortilleria is located 75 feet from the parking lot, his customers have difficulties finding available parking in the parking lot.

Staff presented the results of the site evaluation and recommended the installation of 40 feet of parallel "15-minute" parking (which equals two parking spaces) in front of the Tortilleria during the business hours of the Tortilleria. After discussion, the Traffic Safety Committee voted unanimously to approve staff's recommendation to install 40 feet of parallel "15-minute" parking, valid daily from 7:00am to 7:00pm, located on 730 E. 7th Street in front of "Tortilleria El Grano De Oro" to increase parking turnover for customers.

If approved by City Council, all work will be performed by City Public Works.

DISCUSSION:

Mr. Heriberto Gutierrez, owner of "Tortilleria El Grano de Oro" (Tortilleria), located at 730 E. 7th Street has requested time restricted parking on E. 7th Street in front of the Tortilleria in order to increase parking turnover for customers. Mr. Gutierrez stated that the customers are unable to find on-street parking easily and drive out of the area in order to find available parking. Furthermore, Mr. Gutierrez stated that parking spaces in front his of his business are frequently occupied by vehicles all day. According to Mr. Gutierrez, the conversion from unrestricted parking to "15-minute" parking will provide customers ample time to shop at the Tortilleria and increase parking turnover for customers.

Staff visited the site and confirmed that the Tortilleria is located on the south side of E. 7th Street. E. 7th Street is a 2-lane local roadway with on-street parking on both side of the street and a posted speed limit of 25 mph. Staff confirmed that the commercial building where the Tortilleria is located offers customer parking located at Highland Avenue and E. 7th Street which provides ten (10) parking spaces, including one disabled parking space. The Tortilleria is located on E. 7th Street approximately 75 feet west from the parking lot. In front of the Tortilleria there are approximately 72 feet (equal to three (3) parking spaces) of unrestricted parking available, between the driveway of the residence located at 720 E. 7th Street and the driveway of the customer parking lot at the commercial building.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the installation of 40 feet of parallel "15-minute" parking located on E. 7th Street in front of "Tortilleria El Grano de Oro" to increase parking turnover for customers.

At the October 10, 2018 Traffic Safety Committee meeting, Ms. Coyote Moon, committee member, requested the City's attention to the intersection at Paradise Drive and E. 11th Street. Ms. Moon expressed concerns regarding visibility for vehicles parked on the northeast corner of E. 11th Street and Paradise Drive. She stated it is difficult to see southbound vehicles travelling on Paradise Drive, which presents a safety concern for drivers.

Staff visited the site and confirmed that Paradise Drive and E. 11th Street are 2-lane local roadways with prima facie speed limits of 25 mph and unrestricted parallel parking on both sides of the streets. Staff confirmed that the intersection is currently Stop controlled for westbound traffic on E. 11th Street. Paradise Drive spans one block north and one block south of E. 11th Street, from E. 10th Street to E. 12th Street. E. 11th Street ends on a cul-de-sac on the east side of Paradise Drive. On the east side of Paradise Drive there is approximately 60 feet of unrestricted parallel parking between the northeast curb return at Paradise Drive and E. 11th Street and the driveway of the residence located at 1035 Paradise Drive. At the intersection, the slope of Paradise Drive is 7%. Staff also reviewed the traffic collision history for this intersection, which confirmed there were no "reported" traffic collisions within the past four years.

This item was presented to the Traffic Safety Committee on November 14, 2018. A public notice was mailed out to area residents. There were no members of the community present to speak on the item.

Based on the staff report, the Traffic Safety Committee approved staff's recommendation to install 20 feet of red curb "No Parking" on the east side of Paradise Drive, north of E. 11th Street, to enhance visibility and access from E. 11th Street onto Paradise Drive.

Staff visited the site and confirmed that Paradise Drive and E. 11th Street are 2-lane local roadways with prima facie speed limits of 25 mph and unrestricted parallel parking on both sides of the streets. Staff confirmed that the intersection is currently Stop controlled for westbound traffic on E. 11th Street. Paradise Drive spans one block north and one block south of E. 11th Street, from E. 10th Street to E. 12th Street. E. 11th Street ends on a cul-de-sac on the east side of Paradise Drive. On the east side of Paradise Drive there are approximately 60 feet of unrestricted parking between the beginning of the curb radius of the northeast corner at Paradise Drive and E. 11th Street and the driveway of the residence located at 1035 Paradise Drive. At the intersection, the slope of Paradise Drive is 7%.

Staff also reviewed the traffic collision history for this intersection, which confirmed there was no "reported" traffic collision within the past four years.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the installation of 20 feet of red curb "No Parking" on the east side of Paradise Drive, north of E. 11th Street, to enhance visibility and access from E. 11th Street onto Paradise Drive.

EXPLANATION

Ms. Elisa Jimenez, resident of 1911 Orange Street, has requested a blue curb disabled persons parking space in front to her residence. The resident possesses a valid disabled person placard from the California Department of Motor Vehicles. Ms. Jimenez's son-in-law, Mr. Steve McElhinney who also lives at Ms. Jimenez's residence, stated that it is difficult to find on-street parking close to their residence since parking in the area is heavily utilized by residents. Mr. McElhinney also stated that often he has to double park his vehicle in front their residence, in order to provide Ms. Jimenez with easier access to the house. Furthermore, Mr. McElhinney stated that he cannot provide access for Ms. Jimenez from their driveway since the driveway has a steep slope. Mr. McElhinney stated that a blue curb disabled persons parking space would allow him to park his vehicle in front of their residence, providing his mother-in-law with easier access to the house.

Staff visited the site and confirmed that Ms. Jimenez's residence does not have a garage, but does have a driveway located on the north side of the house. The driveway is 48 feet long by 11 feet wide with a slope of approximately 4%. Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) guidelines require a cross-slope of no more than 2%. Therefore, the driveway cannot accommodate a vehicle with a disabled driver or passenger. Staff also confirmed that the driveway has a manual gate approximately 10 feet wide. There is approximately 27 feet of unrestricted parallel parking in front of Ms. Jimenez's residence. The slope of Orange Street in front of Ms. Jimenez's residence is approximately 2%.

The City Council has adopted a policy which is used to evaluate requests for disabled persons parking spaces. The City Council Disabled Persons Parking Policy requirements for "Special Hardship" cases are as follows:

1. Applicant (or guardian) must be in possession of valid license plates or placard for "disabled persons" or "disabled veterans". *This condition is met.*
2. The proposed disabled parking space must be in front (or side if on a corner lot) of the applicant's (or guardian's) place of residence. *This condition is met.*
3. The residence must not have useable off-street parking available or an off-street space available that may be converted into disabled parking. *This condition is met, since the applicant has a driveway with a slope that is greater than 2% and therefore, cannot accommodate a vehicle with a disabled driver or passenger.*

This item was presented to the Traffic Safety Committee on November 14, 2018. Ms. Jimenez and Mr. Steve McElhinney were in attendance and they spoke in support a blue curb disabled persons parking space in front of their residence. Staff presented the results of the site evaluation and after discussion, the Traffic Safety Committee voted to approve staff's recommendation to install a blue curb disabled persons parking space with sign in front of the residence located at 1911 Orange Street, since all three conditions of the City Council Disabled Persons Parking Policy for "Special Hardship" cases are met.

Staff informed Ms. Jimenez that handicap parking spaces do not constitute "personal reserved parking" and that any person with valid "disabled persons" license plates or placards may park in handicap spaces.

Ms. Elisa Jimenez, resident of 1911 Orange Street, has requested a blue curb disabled persons parking space in front to her residence. Ms. Jimenez's son-in-law, Mr. Steve McElhinney who also lives at Ms. Jimenez's residence, stated that it is difficult to find on-street parking space close to their residence since parking in the area is heavily utilized from area residents. Mr. McElhinney also stated that often he has to double park his vehicle in front their residence, in order to provide Ms. Jimenez with easier access to the house. Furthermore, Mr. McElhinney stated that he cannot provide access to Ms. Jimenez from their driveway since the driveway has a very high slope. Mr. McElhinney stated that a blue curb disabled persons parking space would allow him to park his vehicle in front of their residence, providing his mother-in-law with an easier access to the house.

Staff visited the site and confirmed that Ms. Jimenez does not have a garage but she has a driveway located on the north side of the house. The driveway is 48 feet long by 11 feet wide with a slope of approximately 4%. Staff also confirmed that the driveway has a manual gate approximately 10 feet wide. There are approximately 27 feet of unrestricted parallel parking in front of Ms. Jimenez's residence. The slope of Orange Street in front of Ms. Jimenez's residence is approximately 2%.

The City Council has adopted a policy which is used to evaluate requests for disabled persons parking spaces. The City Council Disabled Persons Parking Policy requirements for "Special Hardship" cases are as follows:

1. Applicant (or guardian) must be in possession of valid license plates or placard for "disabled persons" or "disabled veterans". *This condition is met.*

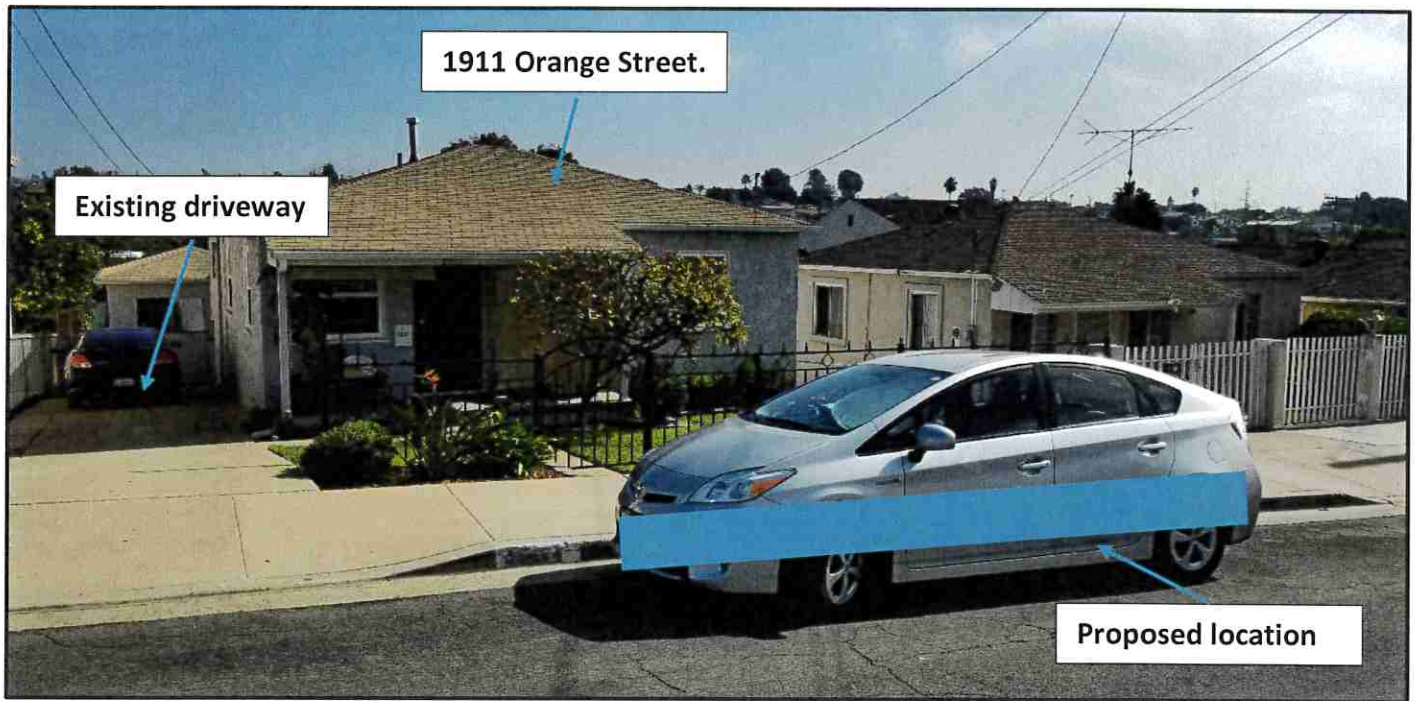

DISABLED PERSONS PARKING POLICY

The purpose of a disabled persons parking zone is to provide designated parking spaces at major points of assembly for the exclusive use of physically disabled persons whose vehicle displays a distinguishing license plate as authorized by the California Department of Motor Vehicles.

The City Council may upon recommendation of the City Engineer, designate specially marked and posted on-street parking spaces for disabled persons pursuant to California Vehicle Code 21101, et seq. at the following facilities:

1. Government buildings serving the public such as administration buildings, public employment offices, public libraries, police stations, etc.
2. Hospitals and convalescent homes with more than 75-bed capacity.
3. Medical facilities and doctors' offices staffed by a maximum of five practitioners. Zones shall be located to serve a maximum number of facilities on one block.
4. Community service facilities such as senior citizens service centers, etc.
5. Accredited vocational training and educational facilities where no off-street parking is provided for disabled persons.
6. Employment offices for major enterprises employing more than 200 persons.
7. Public recreational facilities including municipal swimming pools, recreation halls, museums, etc.
8. Public theaters, auditoriums, meeting halls, arenas, stadiums with more than 300 seating capacity.
9. Other places of assembly such as schools and churches.
10. Commercial and/or office building(s) with an aggregate of more than 50,000 square feet of usable floor space. Zone shall be located to serve a maximum number of facilities on one block.
11. Hotels catering to daily guests, maintaining a ground floor lobby and a switchboard that is operated 24 hours per day.

12. A hotel or apartment house catering to weekly or monthly guests and containing more than 30 separate living units.

In addition, disabled persons parking spaces may be provided within all publicly owned, leased or controlled off-street parking facilities as specified in the General Requirements.

General Requirements

Each disabled persons parking space shall be indicated by blue paint and a sign (white on blue) showing the international symbol of accessibility (a profile view of a wheelchair with occupant).

Where installed under the above criteria the total number of disabled persons curb parking spaces will be limited to 3% of the total number of on-street parking spaces available in the area and shall be distributed uniformly within the area.

Disabled persons parking will not be installed at locations with a full-time parking prohibition. When a disabled persons parking zone is installed where a part-time parking prohibition is in effect, the disabled persons parking zone will have the same time restrictions as the part-time parking prohibition.

The cost of installing disabled persons parking will be assumed by the City on public streets and public off-street parking facilities.

In establishing on-street parking facilities for the disabled there shall be a reasonable determination made that the need is of an on-going nature. The intent is to prevent the proliferation of special parking stalls that may be installed for a short-term purpose but later are seldom used. Unjustified installation of such parking stalls unnecessarily increases the City's maintenance and operations costs, reduce available on-street parking for the general public, and detract from the overall effectiveness of the disabled persons parking program.

Special Hardship Cases

It is not the intention of the City to provide personal reserved parking on the public right-of-way, especially in residential areas. However, exceptions may be made, in special hardship cases, provided all of the following conditions exists:

- (1) Applicant (or guardian) must be in possession of valid license plates for "disabled persons" or "disabled veterans."
- (2) The proposed disabled parking space must be in front of the applicant's (or guardian's) place of residence.

- (3) Subject residence must not have useable off-street parking available or off-street space available that may be converted into disabled parking.

NOTE: It must be emphasized that such parking spaces do not constitute "personal reserved parking" and that any person with valid "disabled persons" license plates may park in the above stalls.



EXPLANATION:

At the City Council meeting of November 20, 2018, City Council introduced an Ordinance related to the use of Electronic Smoking Devices. There was a question as to whether the changes to section 10.52.010 (HH) meant that smoking was permitted on golf courses, which it was previously and will continue to be. The question arose due to the term "golf course" being included in an earlier part of the same Code section, which caused some confusion. Ultimately, no changes have been made as the Code section, read in context, continues to make sense. The Code section is attached for your reference in its entirety for your reference.

The attached Ordinance needs to be adopted in order to complete the amendment process.

Chapter 10.52 - REGULATIONS FOR THE USE OF MUNICIPAL PARKS, PLAYGROUNDS AND GOLF COURSES

10.52.010 - Prohibited activities.

No person shall engage in any of the following acts within the premises of any city park, playground, golf course, or recreation facility:

- A. Transport, carry, or discharge any firearm, weapon, air gun, slingshot, or explosive of any kind.
- B. Use archery equipment, hit golf balls, play baseball, football, soccer, cricket or any other game of ball, in a designated picnic area.
- C. Bring, ride, allow, or permit any bovine animal, sheep, goat, swine, or horse to enter or occupy the premises.
- D. Bring or permit any dog, other than a seeing-eye dog, to enter or occupy the premises, unless the same is kept on a leash adequate to control such dog at all times. This prohibition against dogs off-leash does not apply to dogs within a "leash free" area, or city designated "dog park."
- E. Take, kill or maltreat any bird or animal, either wild or domestic.
- F. Pick, dig, remove, carry away, or willfully damage or destroy park improvements, soil, plants or trees on the premises.
- G. Drive or ride a motorcycle, automobile, or any other motorized vehicle on any walkway or turfed area.
- H. Willfully damage or vandalize any building or structure located upon the premises.
- I. Except for pedestrians or joggers, enter or occupy the premises between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. without the consent of the city council, the city manager, or their authorized agents.
- J. Enter or trespass in any area, building or facility which is fenced and locked.
- K. Drive or operate any motor vehicle in any park in excess of fifteen miles per hour.
- L. Park any automobile or vehicle in any park at any place other than designated parking areas. Places where parking is permitted shall be designated by appropriate signs.
- M. Wash, perform maintenance on, or make other than emergency repairs upon any automobile, motorcycle or self-driven vehicle in any park.
- N. Make a fire in any park other than in stoves, pits or braziers provided by the city.
- O. Except for charcoal lighter, bring into any park any material which will, if spilled or spread, be injurious to the turf or plant growth.

- P. Throw or dispose of any bottles, tin cans, broken glass, paper, clothes, cast iron, rubbish, soil, or other debris of any kind, except in approved containers provided by the city.
- Q. Willfully remove, damage or destroy any athletic equipment provided by the city. Normal wear and tear is acceptable
- R. Move or remove from one location to another any part or parts of field equipment.
- S. Open or close any valve pertaining to the water mains or sprinkler system, or to expose or interfere with any gas pipe, hydrant, pitcock, sewer, catch basin, backflow preventer, or other similar device in any park.
- T. Indulge in indecent or riotous conduct or language, or to otherwise make noises in such a manner as to disturb any picnic, meeting, concert or activity.
- U. Operate a public address system without prior written permission of the city. This prohibition shall not include the use of small portable radios, as long as such radios are operated at such a volume as not to disturb other persons present in the park.
- V. Willfully disturb or interfere with any employee of the city acting within the scope of his or her employment, or to disturb or interfere with any spectator or participant in any event or activity conducted in any park, or to enter any park for the purpose of committing any such disturbance or interference.
- W. Camp or lodge overnight in or upon any park, unless prior written permission is obtained from the city.
- X. Sell refreshments, foodstuffs or novelties in any park or on any street immediately adjacent thereto without the prior written permission of the city council.
- Y. Practice, carry on, conduct or solicit for any trade, occupation, business or profession without the written permission of the city council.
- Z. Play upon any tennis court wearing shoes other than tennis-type shoes.
- AA. Use any tennis court for tennis tournaments, team practices, or other special events of any kind without the prior written permission of the city.
- BB. Wade or swim in any pool except when supervised.
- CC. Use any park facility for which a charge is made without first having paid the fee requested and having received the required permit.
- DD. Remove any authorized or official sign indicating that any park facility or equipment is reserved.
- EE. For any male person to use any toilet set apart for women, and for any female person to use any toilet set apart for men, provided, that this prohibition shall not apply to children accompanied by their father, mother or guardian.
- FF. Climb onto any building or structure not designated for such activity.
- GG. Tear down, deface or destroy any sign posted pursuant to the above sections.

HH. Except in any golf course, possess a lighted or burning tobacco product or tobacco-related product, including but not limited to cigars, cigarettes and pipes; use, including chewing of, tobacco or tobacco-related products; dispose of any lighted or unlighted tobacco or tobacco-related product in any place other than a designated waste disposal container.

ORDINANCE NO. 2018 – 2452

ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NATIONAL CITY
AMENDING THE NATIONAL CITY MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING
CHAPTER 9.37 (PROHIBITION OF SMOKING IN OPEN AIR DINING AREAS),
CHAPTER 9.38 (RESTRICTING THE SALE, DISPLAY, AND PROMOTION OF
TOBACCO PRODUCTS OR CIGARETTES TO MINORS), AND CHAPTER 10.52
(REGULATIONS FOR THE USE OF MUNICIPAL PARKS, PLAYGROUNDS
AND GOLF COURSES) RELATED TO ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICES

WHEREAS, the City of National City (the "City"), pursuant to the police powers delegated to it by the California Constitution, has the authority to enact or amend laws which promote the public health, safety, and general welfare of its residents; and

WHEREAS, National City Municipal Code Chapters 9.37, 9.38, and 10.52 currently regulate tobacco product use and prohibits smoking in certain public areas but does not encompass the use of electronic smoking devices; and

WHEREAS, electronic smoking devices or "e-cigarettes" are battery-operated devices designed to deliver nicotine, flavors, and other substances through a vapor inhaled by the user; and

WHEREAS, during the past several years the popularity of electronic smoking devices, including electronic cigarettes or "e-cigarettes", in this country has grown exponentially; and

WHEREAS, while relatively new, there are several studies that have determined that there are significant health concerns related to electronic smoking devices and vaping, including at least one study that shows secondhand aerosol exhaled by users contains nicotine and toxins causing potentially harmful effects from passive inhalation of the vapors on bystanders; and

WHEREAS, the use of electronic smoking devices in locations where other types of cigarettes, pipes, and cigars are prohibited may cause confusion and uncertainty, and make it more difficult to enforce bans on smoking; and

WHEREAS, California state law prohibits the sale of electronic smoking devices to minors; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of National City desires to amend the National City Municipal Code as it regulates and prohibits smoking and the use of tobacco products in Chapters 9.37, 9.38, and 10.52 to include electronic smoking devices and other similar devices in order to promote a smoke free environment for its citizens and visitors in the City.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the terms and provisions of the California Government Code, proceedings were duly initiated for the amendment of the National City Municipal Code (NCMC).

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council does ordain as follows:

Section 1. All protests, if any, against said amendment to the Municipal Code and each of them be and hereby are denied and overruled.

Section 2. That Subsection 9.37.010 (D) of the National City Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

9.37.010 Definitions.

D. "Smoking" means inhaling, exhaling, burning, or carrying any lighted or heated cigar, cigarette, or pipe, or any other lighted or heated tobacco or plant product intended for inhalation, whether natural or synthetic, in any manner or in any form. "Smoking" includes the use of an electronic smoking device that creates an aerosol or vapor, in any manner or in any form, or the use of any oral smoking device for the purpose of circumventing the prohibition of smoking.

Section 3. That Section 9.37.010 of the National City Municipal Code is amended to add subsections (E) and (F) as follows:

E. "Tobacco product" means any of the following:

1. A product containing, made, or derived from tobacco or nicotine that is intended for human consumption, whether smoked, heated, chewed, absorbed, dissolved, inhaled, snorted, sniffed, or ingested by any other means, including, but not limited to, cigarettes, cigars, little cigars, chewing tobacco, pipe tobacco, or snuff.

2. An electronic device that delivers nicotine or other vaporized liquids to the person inhaling from the device, including, but not limited to, an electronic cigarette, cigar, pipe, or hookah.

3. Any component, part, or accessory of a tobacco product, whether or not sold separately.

F. "Tobacco product" does not include a product that has been approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration for sale as a tobacco cessation product or for other therapeutic purposes where the product is marketed and sold solely for such an approved purpose.

Section 4. That Section 9.38.050 of the National City Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

Section 9.38.050 Exceptions to location of tobacco products and tobacco advertising displays inside retail establishments.

A. Section 9.38.040 does not apply to commercial establishments where access to the premises by persons under twenty-one years of age is prohibited by law.

B. Section 9.38.040A does not apply within any establishment to displays containing tobacco products which are not accessible and visible to patrons, or to displays located above, behind or below a sales counter and which are not accessible to patrons. Any display containing tobacco products shall not be used as an "advertising display" as defined in Section 9.38.020.

Section 5. That Section 9.38.080 of the National City Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

Section 9.38.080 Posting of signs regarding tobacco products and cigarette sales to minors.

A. Every tobacco retailer shall post conspicuously in their place of business at each point of purchase a notice stating that the sale of tobacco products and cigarettes to persons under twenty-one years of age is prohibited by law and subject to penalties, except for United States Armed Forces active duty personnel with military ID who are at least 18 years of age. The notice shall also state that photo identification is required to purchase tobacco products and cigarettes. The letters of the sign shall be at least one-half inch in height.

B. Any sign meeting the content requirements of California Business and Professional Code Section 22952(b) and regulations promulgated thereunder, and the posting requirements of California Penal Code Section 308(c), satisfies subsection "A" of this section.

Section 6 That Subsection 10.52.010 (HH) of the National City Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

HH. Except in any golf course, smoke any tobacco products or dispose of any tobacco product in any place other than a designated waste disposal container.

Staff Recommendation

Staff recommends approval of the on-site sale of beer, wine, and distilled spirits at a new restaurant, "Gerry's Grill" subject to the attached recommended conditions. The use is conditionally-allowed in the Major Mixed-Use District zone. The sale of alcohol would be accessory to the restaurant. The sale of alcohol is recommended to be permitted only between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m. to keep in line with the more recent alcohol sales hours approvals.

Executive Summary

The business has applied for a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) to sell beer, wine, and distilled spirits at "Gerry's Grill". The proposed restaurant hours and sale of alcohol hours are 10:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. Sunday, 11:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday, and 11:00 a.m. to 12:00 a.m. Friday and Saturday. A Type 47 (On-Sale General for Bona Fide Public Eating Place) license is concurrently being processed with the California Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC).

Site Characteristics

The property is an existing 6,964 square-foot suite located in Westfield Plaza Bonita Mall. It is in the MXD-2 zone with an approximately 450 square-foot patio attached to the front of the building. The MXD-2 zone continues in all directions from the proposed restaurant with the Interstate 54 Freeway and Small Lot Residential (RS-2) zone farther north. Farther east is the Medium-Low Density Multi-Unit Residential (RS-3) zone and county jurisdiction; farther south is open space; and farther west is the Interstate 805 freeway. The site was previously an El Torito restaurant in 2016.

Proposed Use

The applicant is proposing to sell alcohol for on-site consumption at the new restaurant. The proposed alcohol sales hours are the same as the proposed restaurant hours, 10:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. Sunday, 11:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday, and 11:00 a.m. to 12:00 a.m. Friday and Saturday. The restaurant is proposed to have a full lunch and dinner menu.

Analysis

The sale of alcohol for on-site consumption is conditionally-allowed with the approval of a CUP. Additional requirements for alcohol CUPs include expanded notification, a community meeting, and distance requirements.

Mailing

All property owners and occupants within a distance of 660 feet are required to be notified of a public hearing for alcohol-related CUP applications. Notice of this public hearing was sent to 471 occupants and owners.

Community Meeting

Pursuant to Section 18.30.050 (C), a community meeting was held Thursday, September 27, 2018 from 4:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. at the subject restaurant. There were two community members in attendance, both affiliated with the Institute for Public Strategies (IPS). The topics discussed were hours of operation, menu items, and employee training. According to the applicant, the same 471 occupants and owners were notified.

Distance Requirements

Chapter 18.030.050 (D) of the National City Zoning Code requires a 660-foot distance from sensitive uses such as schools (kindergarten through 12th grade), but allows an exemption for restaurants with greater than 30% of their floor area devoted to seating. Although a charter school is located 300 feet away, Gerry's Grill would be exempt due to over 50% of its floor area being devoted to seating.

Alcohol Sales Concentration/Location

Per ABC, there are currently six on-site sale licenses in this census tract (32.04) where a maximum of four are recommended. Therefore, this census tract is considered by ABC to be over-saturated with regard to alcohol sales outlets. For reference, the on-site alcohol outlets in the census tract are:

Census tract 32.04 includes the area south of the Interstate 54, north of Bonita Road, west of Sweetwater Road, and east of the Interstate 805. The attached census tract map shows the location of the subject tract (Attachment 6).

Hours of Operation

The hours of operation for the existing license holders range from 6:00 a.m. to 1:00 a.m. for the varying properties. Recent alcohol sales hours have been between 10:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. IPS recommends that the serving of alcohol not be permitted after 10:00 p.m. The Police Department rates the sale of alcohol after 11:00 p.m. as a “three” on their rating system, which usually indicates a high risk. With both the Police Department and IPS comments in mind, staff is recommending alcohol sales hours of 10:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. Sunday, 11:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday and 10:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. Friday and Saturday. The approved time for the restaurant at the location prior to Gerry’s Grill (El Torito) was 11:00 p.m. Recommended conditions reflect the hours recommended by staff.

Institute for Public Strategies

IPS provided comments recommending that owners, management, and staff be required to attend the Responsible Beverage Sales and Service (RBSS) training. This requirement is a standard condition of City Council Policy 707 and is included as a condition of approval (Condition No. 6). As previously mentioned, IPS recommended the operation hours of 6:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. and voiced concern for possible “morphing”, a term meaning when a restaurant transforms into a club, raising the possibility of violence, crime, and nuisances, especially in areas with high crime rates.

Police Department (PD)

The ABC Risk Assessment provided by PD allocated a total of 14 points, which places it in the Medium Risk category. Medium risk is considered 13 to 18 points (Attachment 9).

Findings for Approval

The Municipal Code contains six required findings for CUPs as follows:

1. The proposed use is allowable within the applicable zoning district pursuant to a Conditional Use Permit and complies with all other applicable provisions of the Land Use Code.

The use is allowable within the MXD-2 zone pursuant to a CUP and the proposed use meets the required guidelines in the Land Use Code for alcohol sales, as discussed in the staff report.

2. The proposed use is consistent with the General Plan and any applicable specific plan.

Alcohol sales are permitted, subject to a CUP, by the Land Use Code, which is consistent with the General Plan. A restaurant use is consistent with the Major Mixed-Use District land use designation contained in the Land Use and Community Character element of the General Plan.

3. The design, location, size, and operating characteristics of the proposed activity would be compatible with the existing and future land uses in the vicinity.

No expansion of the building is proposed. The proposal involves an existing restaurant space, which was previously analyzed for traffic impacts when it was constructed.

4. The site is physically suitable for the type, density, and intensity of use being proposed, including access, utilities, and the absence of physical constraints.

The proposed alcohol sales would be accessory to the primary use of food sales. A restaurant existed on the site previously.

5. Granting the permit would not constitute a nuisance or be injurious or detrimental to the public interest, health, safety, convenience, or welfare, or materially injurious to persons, property, or improvements in the vicinity and zone in which the property is located.

The proposed use would be subject to conditions that limit the sale of beer, wine, and distilled spirits as well as the hours of availability; it is recommended that no alcohol products be sold before 10:00 a.m. or after 11:00 p.m. In addition, all business staff is required to receive RBSS training.

6. The proposed project has been reviewed in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).

The project is not considered a project under CEQA, as no development is proposed. In addition, the proposed use is similar to other commercial uses in the area, which are permitted in the MXD-2 zone.

The following two findings are also included with alcohol CUPs:

7. The proposed use is deemed essential and desirable to the public convenience or necessity.

In this case, alcohol sales would contribute to the viability of the restaurant, an allowed use in the MXD-2 zone.

8. Based on findings 1 through 7 above, public convenience and necessity would be served by a proposed use of the property for the retail sale of alcoholic beverages pursuant to law.

Findings for Denial

Due to the census tract being over-saturated, and being that there are other on-sale outlets in the area, there are also findings for denial as follows:

1. Granting the permit would constitute a nuisance or be injurious or detrimental to the public interest, health, safety, convenience, or welfare, or materially injurious to persons, property, or improvements in the vicinity and zone in which the property is located.

The census tract in which the subject property is located is currently over-concentrated with regard to on-sale alcohol outlets. Six on-sale outlets are permitted where four are recommended by the ABC. In addition, the area has a high crime rate and was assessed by PD as a medium risk.

2. The proposed use is not deemed essential to the public necessity.

There are six locations in census tract 32.04 that already sell alcohol for on-site consumption.

3. Based on findings 1 and 2 above, the public convenience and necessity will not be served by the proposed use of the property for the retail sale of alcoholic beverages pursuant to law.

Conditions of Approval

Standard Conditions of Approval have been included with this permit, as well as conditions specific to on-site sale of alcohol per City Council Policy 707; the policy requires that the sale of alcohol shall not exceed the sale of food, that alcohol shall be available only in conjunction with the purchase of food, and RBSS training for staff.

Summary

The proposed use is consistent with the General Plan due to alcohol sales for on-site consumption being a conditionally-allowed use in the MXD-2 zone. The proposed use would be accessory to the proposed restaurant. In order for the sale of alcohol to be consistent with what has been approved previously, the recommended alcohol sales hours are 10:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. Sunday, 11:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday and 10:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. Friday and Saturday.

Options

1. Approve 2018-22 CUP subject to the attached recommended conditions, based on the attached findings, or findings to be determined by the Planning Commission; or
2. Deny 2018-22 CUP based on the attached findings or findings to be determined by the Planning Commission; or,
3. Continue the item to a specific date in order to obtain additional information.

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission of the City of National City considered a Conditional Use Permit for the on-site sale of beer and wine at an existing restaurant for a property located at 3030 Plaza Bonita Road #2510 at a duly advertised public hearing held on November 19, 2018, at which time oral and documentary evidence was presented; and,

WHEREAS, at said public hearings the Planning Commission considered the staff report contained in Case File No. 2018-22 CUP maintained by the City and incorporated herein by reference along with evidence and testimony at said hearing; and,

WHEREAS, this action is taken pursuant to all applicable procedures required by State law and City law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Planning Commission of the City of National City, California, that the testimony and evidence presented to the Planning Commission at the public hearing held on November 19, 2018, support the following findings:

1. The proposed use is allowable within the applicable zoning district pursuant to a Conditional Use Permit and complies with all other applicable provisions of the Land Use Code, because alcohol sales for on-site consumption is a conditionally-allowed use in the MXD-2 zone and the proposed use meets the required guidelines in the Land Use Code for alcohol sales.
2. The proposed use is consistent with the General Plan because alcohol sales are permitted, subject to a Conditional Use Permit, by the Land Use Code, which is consistent with the General Plan. In addition, a restaurant use is consistent with the Major mixed-Use District land use designation contained in the Land Use and Community Character (LU) element of the General Plan.

3. The design, location, size, and operating characteristics of the proposed activity would be compatible with the existing and future land uses in the vicinity, because no expansion of the building is proposed, and the use would be accessory to an allowed commercial use.
4. The site is physically suitable for the type, density, and intensity of the use being proposed, including access, utilities, and the absence of physical constraints because the commercial suite is existing and the proposed alcohol sales would be accessory to the restaurant. The sale of beer, wine, and distilled spirits is not expected to increase the demand for parking on the property.
5. Granting the permit would not constitute a nuisance, be injurious, or detrimental to the public interest, health, safety, convenience, or welfare, or materially injurious to persons, property, or improvements in the vicinity and zone in which the property is located because the proposed use will be subject to conditions that limit the sale of alcohol and the hours that it will be available. No alcohol products will be sold before 10:00 a.m. or after 11:00 p.m. and all business staff is required to receive Responsible Beverage Service & Sales (RBSS) Training.
6. The proposed project has been reviewed in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act, and because there is no development, it has been determined that the proposed use is not a project per the act; there is no calculable increase in traffic and no other impacts are anticipated. The project would not result in any physical changes to the environment.
7. The proposed use is deemed essential and desirable to the public convenience or necessity. Alcohol sales would contribute to the viability of the restaurant, an allowed use in the MXD-2 zone.
8. Based on findings 1 through 7 above, public convenience and necessity will be served by a proposed use of the property for the on-site sales of alcoholic beverages pursuant to law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the application for a Conditional Use Permit is approved subject to the following conditions:

General

1. This Conditional Use Permit authorizes the sale of alcohol for on-site consumption at a new restaurant located at 3030 Plaza Bonita Rd. #2510. Plans submitted for permits associated with this project shall conform to Exhibit A, Case File No. 2018-22 CUP, dated 9/11/2018.

2. Before this *Conditional Use Permit* shall become effective, the applicant and the property owner shall both sign and have notarized an Acceptance Form, provided by the Planning Department, acknowledging and accepting all conditions imposed upon the approval of this permit. Failure to return the signed and notarized Acceptance Form within 30 days of its receipt shall automatically terminate the *Conditional Use Permit*. The applicant shall also submit evidence to the satisfaction of the Planning Department that a Notice of Restriction on Real Property is recorded with the County Recorder. The applicant shall pay necessary recording fees to the County. The Notice of Restriction shall provide information that conditions imposed by approval of the *Conditional Use Permit* are binding on all present or future interest holders or estate holders of the property. The Notice of Restriction shall be approved as to form by the City Attorney and signed by the Deputy City Manager prior to recordation.
3. This permit shall become null and void if not exercised within one year after adoption of the resolution of approval unless extended according to procedures specified in the Municipal Code.
4. This permit shall expire if the use authorized by this resolution is discontinued for a period of 12 months or longer. This permit may also be revoked, pursuant to provisions of the Land Use Code, if discontinued for any lesser period of time.
5. This *Conditional Use Permit* may be revoked if the operator is found to be in violation of any Conditions of Approval.

Planning

6. The sale of alcohol shall not exceed the sale of food. With the annual renewal of the City business license, the business proprietor shall submit a statement clearly indicating total alcoholic beverage sales and total food sales. Said statement shall be subject to audit and verification by employees of the City, who are authorized to examine, audit and inspect such books and records of the license, as may be necessary in their judgment to verify that the sale of alcohol does not exceed the sale of food. All information obtained by an investigation of records shall remain confidential.
7. All-sellers of alcohol shall receive Responsible Beverage Service and Sales (RBSS) training, including all owners, and managers. The RBSS training must be certified by the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC). Proof of completion of an approved RBSS program must be provided prior to issuance of a city business license. As part of the RBSS training, the permittee shall make available a domestic violence training session as provided by the Institute of Public Strategies.

8. The sale of alcoholic beverages shall be permitted only between the hours of 10:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. Sunday, 11:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday and 10:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. Friday and Saturday Alcohol shall be available only in conjunction with the purchase of food.
9. Permittee shall post signs in the patio dining area, including all exits to outdoor seating areas, indicating that alcoholic beverages must be consumed inside the restaurant or patio area and may not be taken off-premises.
10. No live entertainment is permitted without modification of this CUP or issuance of a Temporary Use Permit.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this Resolution be transmitted forthwith to the applicant and to the City Council.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that this Resolution shall become effective and final on the day following the City Council meeting where the Planning Commission resolution is set for review, unless an appeal in writing is filed with the City Clerk prior to 5:00 p.m. on the day of that City Council meeting. The City Council may, at that meeting, appeal the decision of the Planning Commission and set the matter for public hearing.

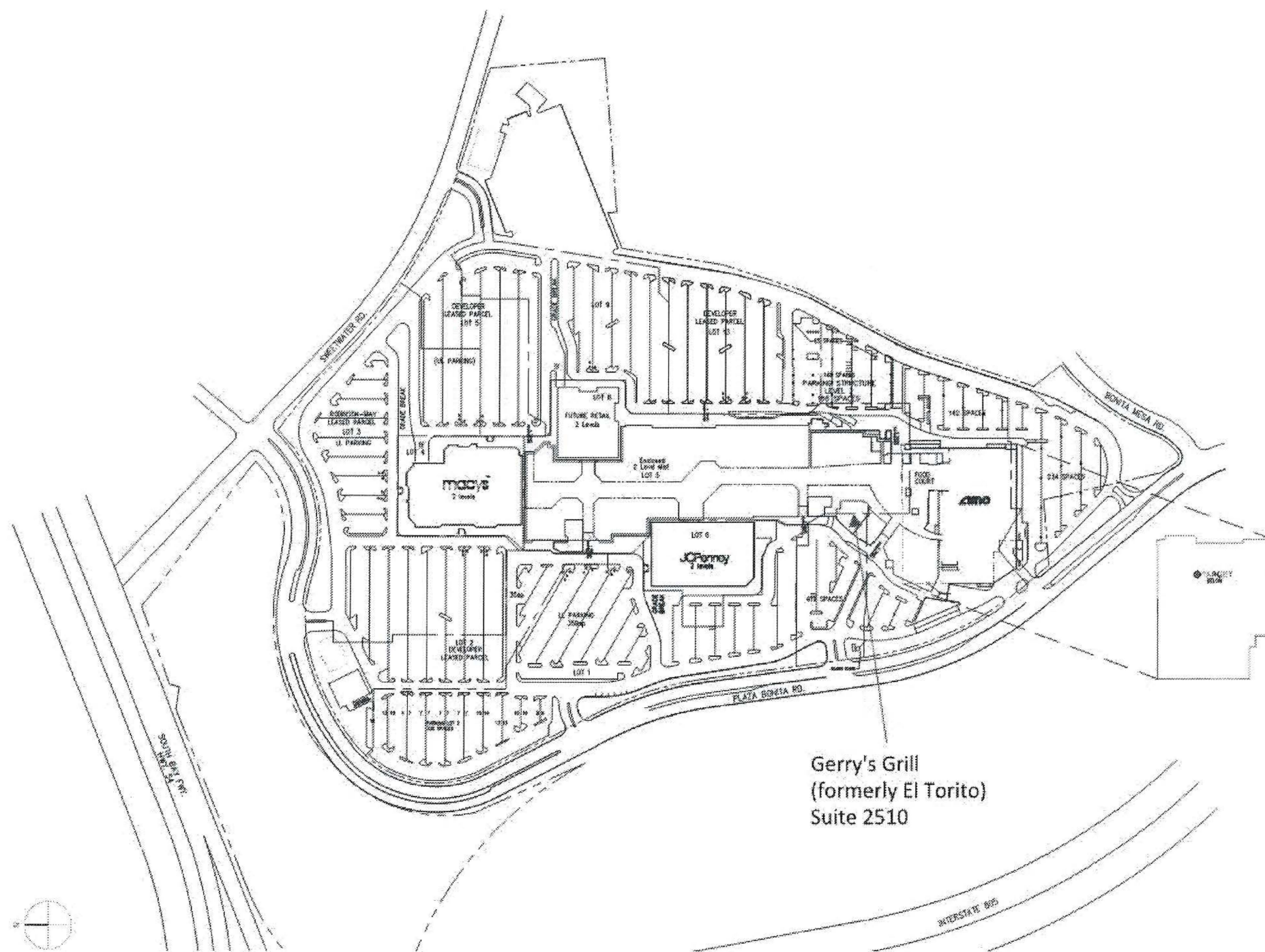

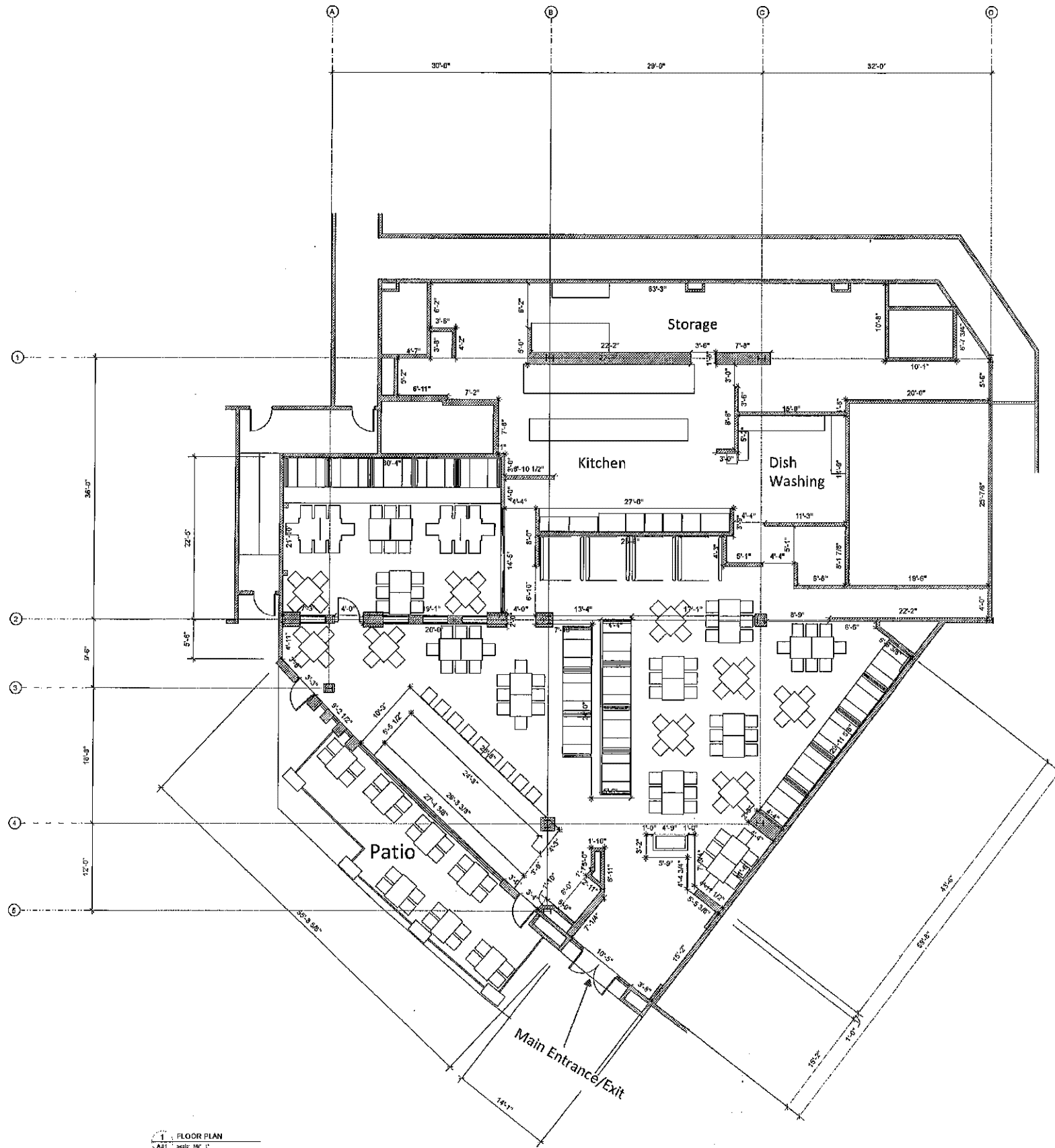

The City of National City's fiscal year begins on July 1st and ends on June 30th of the following year. Pursuant to Section 2.55.040 of the National City Municipal Code, the City Council must adopt the budget for the ensuing fiscal year by June 30th of each year.

Development of the City's annual budget is a City-wide effort occurring over a six- to seven-month period. The tentative fiscal year 2020 budget schedule includes presentation of budgetary priorities at the City Council meeting scheduled for January 22, 2019. In addition, two workshops are proposed for April 9 and April 23, 2019 for presentation and discussion of the preliminary budget. The latter meeting date may not be needed but is placed on the calendar as a contingency. Budget adoption is planned for June 4, 2019.

With this item, staff seeks approval of the tentative budget workshop dates. If the dates are not agreeable to the majority of the City Council, direction on alternative dates is sought.



Chapter 11.68 - CRUISING

Sections:

11.68.010 - Cruising defined.

"Cruising" means the repetitive driving of a motor vehicle two or more times within a four-hour period, in the same direction, past a traffic-control point in traffic which is congested at or near the traffic-control point, as determined by the ranking police officer on duty within the affected area, and after the vehicle operator or passenger has been given an adequate written notice that further driving past the control point will be a violation.

(Ord. 2025 (part), 1992)

11.68.020 - Signs designate cruising control zone.

Signs shall be placed at the beginning and end of the portion of any street determined to be subject to cruising controls which briefly and clearly state the appropriate provisions of Section 11.68.050 of this code, and of Section 21100(k) of the California Vehicle Code.

(Ord. 2025 (part), 1992)

11.68.030 - Traffic-control point—Establishment authority.

The ranking police officer on duty within an area affected by traffic congestion may establish one or more traffic-control points at or near the area of traffic congestion.

(Ord. 2025 (part), 1992)

11.68.040 - Traffic-control point—Written notice of violation.

Any person who, as the operator of, or passenger in, any motor vehicle driven in a particular direction past a traffic-control point established pursuant to Section 11.68.030 may be given written notice that further driving past the control point within a four-hour interval will be a violation of Section 11.68.050.

(Ord. 2025 (part), 1992)

11.68.050 - Cruising prohibited.

It is unlawful for any person, as a driver or a passenger of a motor vehicle, to engage in the activity known as "cruising," as defined in Section 11.68.010, on the public streets or alleys of the city in any area which has been posted pursuant to Section 11.68.020. Each successive trip within a four-hour period past

the traffic-control point established pursuant to Section 11.68.030 shall constitute a separate violation, and no additional written notice shall be required for such separate violation.

(Ord. 2025 (part), 1992)

11.68.060 - Exceptions.

This chapter shall not apply to persons who, according to DMV records, reside within a designated no-cruising area; nor to authorized emergency vehicles as defined in Section 165 of the California Vehicle Code; nor to vehicles licensed for public transportation; nor to publicly owned vehicles of any city, county, district, state or federal agency.

(Ord. 2025 (part), 1992)

11.68.070 - Violation—Penalty.

Any person violating any provision of this chapter is guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not exceeding one thousand dollars, or by imprisonment not to exceed six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

City Council discussion and direction on amended City Council Policy No. 104 – “Rules of Procedure and Order for City Council Meetings” (currently titled “Conduct of City Council Meetings”)

BACKGROUND:

At the July 24, 2018 regular meeting of the City Council of the City of National City, Council directed staff to return with an agenda item to discuss City Council Policy No. 104, “Conduct of City Council Meetings”.

At the September 4, 2018 regular meeting, Council directed staff to amend Council Policy No. 104 to include procedural language on order, decorum and enforcement, meeting schedule and length, agenda sequence, dais seating, and annual recess. The Council also requested staff conduct a survey of city council meeting schedules across San Diego County.

This item responds to the Council’s request.

DISCUSSION:

City Council Policy No. 104, adopted December 13, 1983, establishes rules of conduct for meetings of the City Council to facilitate orderly proceedings and comply with applicable state law. The City Council updated the policy on October 8, 2013 to provide that all meetings of the City Council be conducted under Rosenberg’s Rules of Order and governed by the Ralph M. Brown Act and other applicable state laws. The policy applies to all Boards, Commissions and Committees.

Policy No. 104, in its original form, is limited in scope and does not address key areas to ensure orderly public meetings, such as the general order and conduct of meetings, decorum, enforcement, agenda sequence and order of business, meeting schedule, council meeting length, and city council recess periods.

As proposed, the amended policy would establish rules of procedure and order for city officials, staff and members of the public at all meetings of the City Council to ensure that the business of the City is attended to in an open and orderly manner and in an environment safe for all persons in attendance. The policy would also memorialize current Council practices and procedures as they pertain to public meetings, as well as consolidate several existing Council policies into one.

Survey Results:

At the September 4, 2018 meeting, the Council discussed National City’s meeting schedule and whether to designate an end time for city meetings. The attached survey results show that out of the 18 Cities surveyed and the County of San Diego, thirteen (13) cities meet twice a month; the remaining five (5) cities and the County have various meeting schedules ranging from weekly, twice weekly, to three per month.

The City of Solana Beach is the only city whose policy provides a designated end time of 10:30pm for council meetings; the City of Carlsbad's Planning Commission has a designated end time of 10:00 pm.

Provided for Council's information is the average length for National City's Council meetings for the past three years:

- 2018 – 4 hours, 29 minutes (up to and including meeting of 9/4/18)
- 2017 – 4 hours, 10 minutes
- 2016 – 3 hours, 39 minutes

City Council Policy No. 104**

DRAFT / AMENDED
**Rules of Procedure and Order for
City Council Meetings**

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I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Policy is to establish Rules of Procedure and Order for City officials, staff and members of the public at all meetings of the City Council to ensure that the business of the City is attended to in an open and orderly manner and in an environment safe for all persons in attendance. The policy establishes and delineates general meeting rules, roles and responsibilities, to allow for an orderly meeting where all individuals can exercise their Constitutional rights.

All meetings of the City Council will be conducted under Rosenberg's Rules of Order. In addition, such meetings will be governed in accordance with the Ralph M. Brown Act (Gov. Code § 54950, hereinafter "the Brown Act") and other applicable State laws. Any question about proper procedure will be immediately referred to the City Clerk as parliamentarian.

This policy applies to all persons attending public meetings in the City Council Chambers or any other location where a meeting subject to this policy takes place. In the event of any inconsistency between this policy and State law or regulation, State law or regulation shall apply.

II. RESPONSIBILITIES

It is important to recognize that the City Council acts as a legislative body. No member has extraordinary powers beyond those of other members. While the Mayor and Vice Mayor may have additional ceremonial and administrative responsibilities, in the establishment of policies, voting and in other significant areas, all members are equal. Policy is established and direction is given to City staff by a majority vote of the Council.

While individual Councilmembers may disagree with decisions of the majority, a decision of the majority binds the Council to a course of action and provides staff with direction to follow. In turn, it is staff's responsibility to ensure the policy of the Council is implemented and upheld consistent with the wishes of the majority. Implementation of Council policy by staff does not reflect a bias against Councilmembers who held a minority opinion on an issue.

- A. Responsibilities of Presiding Officer/Mayor: The Presiding Officer of the City Council, shall be the Mayor, or in the Mayor's absence the Vice Mayor, or in both of their absence any other member designated by the City Council. It shall be the duty of the Presiding Officer to ensure that the Rules of Procedure and Order contained herein are observed. The Presiding Officer shall maintain control of communication between Councilmembers and between the Council, staff, and members of the public. The Presiding Officer may make and second motions.

B. Responsibilities of Vice Mayor: In the absence of the Mayor from the City or a Council meeting, the Vice Mayor shall possess all the powers of the office of the Mayor, and be subject to all prescribed duties for that office.

C. Responsibilities of City Council:

1. Members of the City Council shall review all meeting materials in preparation for Council meetings and be prepared to discuss the agenda.
2. Members of the City Council shall arrive on time for all Council meetings.
3. Members of the City Council shall conduct themselves in an orderly, professional and businesslike manner to ensure that the business of the City shall be attended to efficiently and thoroughly and to ensure that the integrity of the deliberative process of the City Council is maintained at all times.
4. Members of the City Council shall maintain a polite, respectful and courteous manner when addressing one another, City staff, and members of the public during City Council meetings.
5. As a courtesy, members of the City Council shall report upcoming absences or out of town trips to the City Manager as soon as possible to ensure that any necessary adjustments to the agenda may be made, and to ensure a quorum.

D. Responsibilities of City Manager:

1. The City Manager's duties during City Council meetings include keeping a record of concerns raised by the City Council regarding direction for future staff action and facilitating the orderly presentation of staff reports.

E. Responsibilities of City Clerk:

1. The City Clerk shall serve as the Parliamentarian for the City Council meetings to advise the Presiding Officer. Within the limitations imposed by Rosenberg's Rules of Order, the Presiding Officer has the authority to determine proper parliamentary procedure.
2. The City Clerk shall call and record roll call votes; and shall read ordinance titles and agenda items as requested by the Presiding Officer.
3. The City Clerk shall keep minutes of the open meeting in accordance with City Council Policy No. 106, and disposition of video recordings of those proceedings.

III. MEETINGS

- A. Regular Meeting: The City Council shall hold regular meetings on the first and third Tuesday of each month. The meetings shall be held in the Council Chambers of City Hall, 1243 National City Boulevard in the City of National City. The regular meeting shall begin at 6:00 p.m., or as otherwise scheduled due to the demand of business or for closed session.
- B. Adjourned Meeting: The City Council may adjourn any regular, adjourned regular, special or adjourned special meeting to a time and place specified in the order of adjournment. If a quorum is not present, less than a quorum may so adjourn.
- C. Special Meeting: A special meeting may be called at any time by the Mayor whenever the public business may require it or upon direction by a majority of the City Council. The call and notice shall be posted at least twenty-four (24) hours prior to the special meeting in a location that is accessible to members of the public.
- D. Emergency Meeting: Pursuant to the Government Code, the twenty-four (24) hour notice and posting requirements for a special meeting may be dispensed with under the following emergency conditions: work stoppage, crippling activity, or other activity that severely impairs public health, safety, or both, as determined by a majority of the members of the legislative body, except in the case of a dire emergency.
- E. Recessed Meeting: Pursuant to the Government Code, a meeting of the City Council may recess to the following regular business day if the action is taken in good faith and not to circumvent the requirements of the Brown Act. The meeting may not be recessed to another day after that unless it is posted in accordance with the Brown Act.
- F. Closed Session Meeting: The City Council may hold closed sessions during a regular or special meeting, or at any time otherwise authorized by law, to consider or hear any matter which is authorized to be heard or considered in closed session in accordance with State law. If a closed session is included on the agenda, the description of the item need only identify the statutory basis for the closed session, and need not include the specific topic which is the subject of the closed session, unless otherwise required by law. For each closed session, the body must orally announce the subject matter of the closed session. If final action is taken in closed session, the body generally must report the action at the conclusion of the closed session.

No minutes of the proceedings of the City Council during closed session are required. There shall be no closed session during any special emergency meeting. No person present in a closed session shall disclose, outside of the closed session, any information revealed in such closed session, without the prior authorization of a majority of the City Council. Any violation of this policy may be enforced by one or more of the actions

delineated in City Council Policy No. 113.

- G. Quorum: A quorum at any meeting of the City Council will be established by the presence of three (3) members of the City Council. The Mayor shall count as a Councilmember for the establishment of a quorum.
- H. City Council Recess Periods: The City Council has traditionally observed a recess period during the summer to provide elected officials and staff an opportunity to catch up on work, reenergize after a lengthy budget and strategic planning process, and prepare for the start of a new fiscal year. For purposes of this policy, a recess period is defined as a period of time longer than thirteen (13) days without a regular or special meeting of the Council.

During any recess period, the City Manager is authorized to take such ministerial actions on matters of operational urgency as would normally be taken by the Council during the recess except for those duties specifically reserved to the Council by Government Code, and including such emergency actions as are necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health or safety. The City Manager shall make a full and complete report to the Council at its first regularly scheduled meeting following the recess of actions taken by the City Manager pursuant to this section, at which time the City Council may make such findings as may be required and confirm said actions of the City Manager.

- I. Cancellation of Meetings: Any meeting of the City Council may be cancelled in advance by a majority vote of the Council. In the event that the Mayor and/or Vice Mayor are unable to cancel a meeting, in the case of an emergency the City Manager is authorized to cancel such meeting.
- J. Location of Meetings: The City Council may hold a regular meeting, special meeting, or adjourned regular or special meeting at another location within the City, or locations outside the jurisdiction of the City, provided appropriate notice is given pursuant to and the location of the meeting is consistent with the Brown Act.
- K. Holidays or Elections: In the event that the regular meeting of the City Council falls on a legal holiday, or an election day on which a National City candidate or National City measure appears on the ballot, no meeting will be held on such day. Any regular meeting may be dispensed with by a majority vote of the City Council.
- L. Adjournment: It is the policy of the City Council that that all evening meetings of the City Council, including special meetings and workshops, be adjourned no later than 10:00 p.m., which time is referred to as the normal time of adjournment.

No new item of business shall be taken up by the Council after the normal time unless the Council has determined by a super-majority vote to set aside this policy. In the event the entire agenda cannot be completed by the normal time of adjournment, the Council may take up and act upon the more pressing agenda items.

All agenda items not considered at the meeting shall be on the agenda of the next regular, special, or adjourned regular meeting unless the Council directs otherwise.

- M. Taping or Broadcasting: Meetings may be broadcast, audio-recorded, video-recorded or "live" streamed so long as the activity does not constitute a disruption of the proceeding.
- N. Teleconferencing: Teleconferencing shall be allowed as per Government Code. Teleconference meetings may be held under carefully defined conditions. The meeting notice must specifically identify all teleconference locations, and each such location must be fully accessible to members of the public.
- O. Agenda Exception: Special procedures permit a body to proceed without an agenda in the case of emergency circumstances, or where a need for immediate action came to the attention of the body after posting of the agenda. (Reference Section VIII, A.5 – Non-Agenda Items Requiring Immediate Action)
- P. Comfort Breaks: It is the policy of the City Council that the Presiding Officer will call comfort breaks of 5-10 minutes when a meeting is expected to last more than two hours. While it is not possible to predict the duration of a meeting, scheduled breaks allow participants to not miss any part of the meeting and help stay alert and maintain a high level of concentration and participation.
- Q. Use of Personal Electronic Devices: The use of personal electronic devices on the dais shall be limited to official agenda-related tasks and emergency notifications. If, in the opinion of the Presiding Officer, a Councilmember's use of an electronic device is disruptive to Council deliberations or disrespectful to the public, the Presiding Officer may request that the Councilmember cease his or her use of such device.
- R. Translation Services: Simultaneous Spanish interpreting services are provided at City Council meetings, through the use of headsets. An interpreter is also available to interpret for speakers who wish to address the Council.
- S. Compliance with Brown Act: All regular, special and adjourned meetings of the City Council shall be called, noticed and conducted in compliance with the Brown Act.

IV. REMOTE ACCESS TO MEETINGS

- A. Internet Broadcast: "Live" streaming video of City Council meetings is available at www.nationalcityca.gov. Archived meetings are also available online.
- B. E-Notification: Individuals may sign up via the City's website to receive email notifications of published City Council and board and commission meeting agendas, City news, special events and more.

V. PUBLIC ASSISTANCE & ACCOMMODATIONS

Upon request, the City Council agenda and backup materials will be made available in alternative formats. Any person who requires a disability-related modification or accommodation, including auxiliary aids or services, to participate in the public meeting, may request a modification, accommodation, aid, or service by contacting the City Clerk's Office either in person or by telephone no later than 10:00 a.m. on the day preceding the scheduled meeting.

VI. PUBLIC MEETING COMMUNICATIONS

- A. Communications between City Councilmembers:
 - 1. Councilmembers wishing to speak should request the floor by being recognized by the Presiding Officer before speaking. The Presiding Officer must recognize any Councilmember who seeks the floor when appropriately entitled to address the City Council.
 - 2. No Councilmember shall speak again until all Councilmembers have had the opportunity to speak.
 - 3. Councilmembers shall remember that the purpose of the Council meeting is to conduct the business of the City. Councilmembers shall avoid repetition and shall limit their comments to the subject matter at hand. Councilmembers shall endeavor to express their views without engaging in unnecessarily lengthy debates.
 - 4. When one Councilmember is speaking, other Councilmembers shall not interrupt, disrupt or disturb the speaker. During questions and deliberations, the Presiding Officer may vary the speaking sequence of Councilmembers from item to item.
- B. Email Communications between City Councilmembers: Because email communications can ultimately lead to the exchange of information intended to, or which may, create collective concurrence among a quorum of Councilmembers, e-mail communications between Councilmembers relative to Council business should be avoided at all times.

- C. Communications with Persons Addressing the City Council: Members of the public may address the City Council during the Public Comment period and/or prior to the consideration of any agenda item. Persons shall address the City Council as a whole and shall not engage in a dialogue with individual Councilmembers, staff, or with other members of the audience. Any person wishing to speak, whether during the Public Comment period or on an agenda item, is requested to complete a "Speaker Request Form" and submit the form to the City Clerk prior to the calling to order of the meeting or as soon thereafter as possible. All those addressing the Council shall do so from the podium.

The City Council may not prohibit public criticism of the City in general, City staff, or members of the City Council, its policies, procedures, programs, or services of an agency or its acts or omissions. A speaker may not be stopped from speaking because either the Presiding Officer or Councilmembers disagree with the viewpoint being expressed.

1. Translation Services: The City strives to provide simultaneous Spanish interpreting services at all regular City Council meetings, through the use of headsets. An interpreter is also available to interpret for speakers who wish to address the Council.
2. Public Comment (Non-agenda): At all regular City Council meetings, speakers shall have the right to address the City Council on any matter within the elected body's jurisdiction, subject to a three (3) minute time limit. The Council may listen to the speaker's comments, but cannot discuss or take action on communications not on the agenda. Non-agenda Public Comment may be referred to the City Manager for administrative action or placement on a subsequent agenda, with a majority vote of the Council.
 - a. At each regular Council meeting, up to 30 minutes shall be reserved for Public Comment.
 - b. The City Clerk will review the speaker slips and inform the Presiding Officer of the number of slips. If the number of speakers, at three (3) minutes each, exceeds the 30-minute allotted time for Public Comment, the Presiding Officer may reduce the time allotted to each speaker, extend Public Comment time, or continue remaining speakers to the end of the meeting.
 - c. Donations of time from one speaker to another will not be permitted.

- d. The Presiding Officer shall have the authority to reduce equally each speaker's time to accommodate a larger number of speakers.
 - e. Speaker slips for Public Comment will be accepted by the City Clerk in the Council Chambers no earlier than 15 minutes before the meeting and up until the Public Comment portion of the agenda is finished.
 - f. In order to ensure that non-English speakers receive the same opportunity to directly address the City Council, any member of the public who utilizes a translator shall be provided at least twice the allotted time to address the Council, unless simultaneous translation equipment is used to allow the Council to hear the translated public testimony simultaneously. (Government Code 54954.3)
 - g. Remarks shall be addressed to the City Council as a body.
 - h. If there is a group representing a common position, designation of a spokesperson is encouraged. The Presiding Officer may allot a mixed amount of time for presentations of this nature.
3. Public Comment (Agenda Items): Speakers shall have the right to address the City Council on items which appear on the agenda, subject to the 3-minute time limit.
- a. Donations of time from one speaker to another will not be permitted.
 - b. The Presiding Officer shall have the authority to reduce equally each speaker's time to accommodate a larger number of speakers, or to limit the total speakers' time on an agenda item.
 - c. Speaker slips for agenda items will be accepted by the City Clerk in the Council Chambers no earlier than 15 minutes before the meeting and up until the public testimony on the item is finished. Included on the speaker slip shall be the option for the individual to register support or opposition but do not wish to speak (individual must be present).
 - d. Remarks shall be addressed to the City Council as a body and not to any member of the City Council, staff or the public. No questions shall be asked of an individual member of the City Council, staff or the public. The Presiding Officer may limit interaction between Councilmembers and public speakers to questions of clarification.

- e. If there is a group representing a common position, designation of a spokesperson is encouraged. The Presiding Officer may allot a mixed amount of time for presentations of this nature.
 - f. In order to ensure that non-English speakers receive the same opportunity to directly address the City Council, any member of the public who utilizes a translator shall be provided at least twice the allotted time to address the Council, unless simultaneous translation equipment is used to allow the Council to hear the translated public testimony simultaneously. (Government Code 54954.3)
4. **Presentations to City Council:** Any information presented to the City Council for its consideration in formats such as PowerPoint, Video VHS, or DVD must be submitted to the City Clerk's office no later than the Wednesday immediately prior to the Council meeting in order to have the presentation facilitated for Council viewing and broadcast. If presentations are submitted after that deadline, it will not be possible for them to be played or displayed during the meeting, although ten (10) hard copies may be submitted to the City Clerk for distribution to the Council. Documents and presentations displayed during the Council meeting shall become a public record and must be submitted to the City Clerk for retention.

VII. AGENDA SEQUENCE AND ORDER OF BUSINESS

Generally, the agenda sequence and order of business at regularly scheduled meetings of the City Council shall be as follows, unless otherwise reordered by the Presiding Officer with the consensus of the City Council.

- A. **Call to Order:** The Presiding Officer officially calls the meeting to order.
- B. **Roll Call:** Before the City Council shall proceed with the business of the Council, the City Clerk shall call the roll of the members and the names of those present shall be entered in the minutes. The later arrival of any absentee shall also be entered in the minutes.
- C. **Pledge of Allegiance:** Each agenda of a regularly scheduled Council meeting shall provide an item for the recital of the "Pledge of Allegiance" to both the United States flag and the California flag.
- D. **Proclamations:** The agenda shall provide a time when proclamations directing attention to a person, organization or event may be presented. Proclamations will be issued subject to Section XIV, E – Proclamations.
- E. **Recognitions & Presentations:** The agenda shall provide a time when recognitions and presentations may be presented.

- F. Public Comments: Speakers shall have the right to address the City Council on any matter within the elected body's jurisdiction, subject to a 3-minute time limit. The City Council may listen to the speaker's comments, but cannot discuss or take action on communications not on the agenda. Non-agenda public comment may be referred to the City Manager for administrative action or placement on a subsequent agenda.
- G. Consent Calendar: Items of a routine or generally uncontested nature may be approved by the Council in a single motion by adoption of the Consent Calendar. The approval of the Consent Calendar shall signify the approval of each matter or recommendation included therein. Upon request of any Councilmember, staff, or public made through the Presiding Officer, an item may be removed from the Consent Calendar for separate discussion and/or action. Each item proposed for consideration as part of the Consent Calendar shall be described on the agenda posted for the meeting.
- H. Public Hearings: Ordinances & Resolutions: This portion of the meeting allows for a noticed public session to receive original evidence or testimony on applications regulated by this title. Scheduled public hearings shall be commenced at 6:00 p.m. or as soon thereafter as possible. (Reference Section XI, Public Hearings)
- I. Non-Consent Resolutions: Items generally of a non-routine nature for City Council discussion and/or action.
- J. New Business: This portion of the meeting is devoted to discussion or consideration of items of business that have or have not previously been before the City Council.
- K. Staff Reports: This portion of the meeting provides the City Manager and staff the opportunity to give general comments, updates, and announcements.
- L. Mayor and City Council Reports: This portion of the meeting provides the City Council the opportunity to give general comments, announcements, or informational reports on any item not on the agenda. These matters may not be discussed or deliberated. This is also the portion of the meeting for a Councilmember who is seeking to place an item on a future meeting agenda to make their request (Reference Section VIII-B, City Council Requests to Place Items on Future Agenda).
- M. Closed Session Report: At an Open Session following a Closed Session, the body must report on final action taken in Closed Session under specified circumstances.
- N. Adjournment: It is the policy of the City Council that that all evening meetings of the City Council, including special meetings and workshops, be adjourned no later than 10:00 p.m., which time is referred to as the normal time of adjournment.

VIII. AGENDA PROCESS

In order for both the City Council and City staff to be adequately prepared to discuss City business during Council meetings, items for discussion shall be placed on the agenda in accordance with established Council agenda deadlines and in compliance with the Brown Act. Generally, items not on the agenda cannot be discussed or considered during a Council meeting. This section of the policy discusses the limits upon non-agenda items and how to place those items onto the agenda, agenda setting, preparation and distribution, and the process by which Councilmembers request to place items on a future agenda.

A. Preparation, Distribution and Posting

1. Agenda Items: In conjunction with City staff, the City Manager shall have the primary responsibility for preparing the City Council agenda and placing matters on the agenda in accordance with identified City needs and scheduling.
 - a. In the event an item is brought to the attention of the City Manager that requires immediate City Council attention after the agenda setting meeting and before the agenda is distributed, the City Manager will determine the need for the item to be added to the agenda.
 - b. With regard to items directed by the City Council made during the regular City Council meeting, such items will be scheduled for the next Council meeting whenever possible. If an item requires additional staff work that cannot be completed in that time frame, the City Manager will advise the Council when staff anticipates the item will be scheduled for Council action.
2. Agenda Review Meeting: Prior to release and posting of a final City Council agenda, an agenda review meeting shall be held by the City Manager with the City Attorney and the Mayor, or another member of the City Council designated by the Mayor, to serve in his/her absence. The proposed agenda shall be reviewed at this meeting.
3. Agenda Preparation: Not later than the Thursday prior to the City Council meeting, the City Manager is responsible for preparing the agenda packet, which shall include the agenda plus all its corresponding duplicated agenda items. No item shall be considered if not included in the packet, except that a correction or supplement to an item already included in the packet may be considered in accordance with the Brown Act.
4. Agenda Distribution and Posting: Not later than the Thursday prior to the City Council meeting, the City Manager is responsible for distributing the agenda packet to each member of the City Council. Staff shall post each agenda at least 72-hours in advance of the meeting and shall post each agenda of a special meeting at least 24-

hours in advance of the meeting on the official bulletin boards at City Hall, Police Department, Library and on the City's website.

5. **Non-Agenda Items Requiring Immediate Action:** Matters requiring City Council action must be placed onto a Council Agenda in a timely manner in order for Council to consider the matter. In accordance with the Brown Act, off-agenda items requiring Council approval will not be considered by the City Council except under the following two circumstances:
 - a. An emergency situation exists, as defined in the Government Code; or,
 - b. The City Council determines by a two-thirds (2/3's) vote, or by a unanimous vote if less than two-thirds of the Council is present, that:
 - There is a need for immediate action, and
 - The need to take action on the item arose after the posting of the agenda.

If the Council finds that the need to take action arose subsequent to the agenda posting, pursuant to the criteria above, it shall make those findings by separate motion, including the factual reasons supporting the findings. The findings shall be reflected in the Council minutes.

- B. **City Council Requests to Place Items on Future Agenda:** A Councilmember seeking to place an item on a future agenda shall make such request under the "Mayor and City Council Comment" portion of the agenda; such request requires a majority vote of the Council.

IX. VOTING

- A. **Obtaining the Floor:** Any Councilmember wishing to speak must first obtain the floor by being recognized by the Presiding Officer. The Presiding Officer must recognize any Councilmember who seeks the floor when appropriately entitled to do so.
- B. **Voting Procedure:** Any vote of the City Council, including a roll call vote, may be registered by the members by answering "Yes" for an affirmative vote, "Abstain" for an abstention, or "No" for a negative vote upon the member's name being called by the City Clerk; or an electronic vote may be registered by pressing the Councilmember button for an affirmative vote, an abstention, or a negative vote, upon a vote being called for by the Presiding Officer.

Following the vote, the City Clerk shall audibly announce the results of the vote by name indicating whether the question carried or was defeated. The same shall be recorded in the minutes as the vote. The Presiding Officer in his or her discretion may publicly explain the effect of a vote for the audience, or may direct a member of the staff to do

so before proceeding to the next item of business.

- C. Disqualification for Conflict of Interest: Any Councilmember who is disqualified from voting on a particular matter by reason of a conflict of interest shall publicly state or have the Presiding Officer state, the nature of such disqualification in open meeting. Where no clearly disqualifying conflict of interest appears, the matter of disqualification may, at the request of the Councilmember affected, be decided by the other Councilmembers. A Councilmember who is disqualified by reason of a conflict of interest in any matter shall not remain in his or her seat during the debate and vote on such matter, but shall request and be given the permission by the Presiding Officer to step down from the Council dais. A Councilmember stating such disqualification shall not be counted as a part of a quorum and shall be considered absent for the purpose of determining the outcome of any vote on such matter.
- D. Failure to Vote: Every Councilmember should vote unless disqualified by reason of a conflict. The vote of a Councilmember who abstains absent a disqualifying conflict of interest shall be counted with the majority vote of the quorum on the question voted upon.
- E. Tie Vote: Tie votes shall be lost motions and may be reconsidered.
- F. Changing Vote: A Councilmember may change his or her vote only if he or she makes a timely request to do so immediately following the announcement of the vote by the City Clerk and prior to the time that the next item in the order of business is taken up.
- G. Reconsideration: A motion to reconsider the vote on any action taken by the City Council at either this meeting or a previous meeting may be made only by one of the Councilmembers who voted with the prevailing side.
- H. Point of Order: An interruption of a meeting to question whether rules or bylaws are being broken, such as the speaker has strayed from the motion currently under consideration.
- I. Continuance of Discussion or Hearings: Any item being discussed or any public hearing at a City Council meeting may, by order, notice, or motion, be continued or tabled to any subsequent meeting.
- J. Rosenberg's Rules of Order: Rosenberg's Rules of Order have been adopted by the City Council and shall apply in all cases.
- K. Disclosure of Ex Parte Contacts: An "ex parte" contact or communication occurs when, prior to considering a matter on a public meeting agenda, a member or members of the City Council receives information, oral, written, or otherwise, pertaining to that matter outside the public meeting. (Reference City Council Policy No. 116 – Procedure for

X. MOTIONS

Motions may be made by any member of the Council including the Chair. Any member of the City Council may second a motion.

- A. Procedure for Motions: The following is the general procedure for making motions:
1. The item is presented by staff or others followed by questions and discussion by Councilmembers.
 2. A Councilmember who wishes to make a motion shall first obtain the floor.
 3. A Councilmember who wishes to second a motion shall do so through a request to the Chair.
 4. Before a motion can be discussed, it shall be seconded.
 5. Once a motion has been properly made and seconded, the Chair shall open the matter for further discussion offering the first opportunity to the moving party and, thereafter, to any Councilmember properly recognized by the Presiding Officer.
 6. Once the matter has been fully debated and the Presiding Officer calls for a vote, no further debate will be allowed, provided however, any Councilmember may be allowed to explain his or her vote prior to the vote being cast.
- B. Amendments to Motions: When a motion is on the floor and an amendment is offered, the amendment shall be acted upon prior to acting on the main motion. No motion of a subject other than the agenda item under consideration shall be admitted as an amendment. A motion to amend an amendment shall be in order, but one to amend an amendment to an amendment shall not be in order. Action shall be taken on the amended amendment prior to any other action to further amend the original motion.

XI. PUBLIC HEARINGS/ORDINANCES & RESOLUTIONS

- A. Except as provided otherwise by law, public hearings shall generally be conducted as follows:
1. Scheduled public hearings shall commence at 6:00 p.m. or as soon thereafter as possible.
 2. Speakers are encouraged to complete a speaker request slip; however a speaker slip is not required in order to speak.

3. At the beginning of each public hearing item, the Presiding Officer shall announce the item for the public hearing, request that staff present the staff report and any other relevant evidence, and open the public hearing. The presentation of the staff report prior to the formal opening of the public hearing shall not prevent its consideration as evidence. Any such evidence shall be made a part of the record of the public hearing.
4. Following the staff report and opening of the public hearing, the Presiding Officer shall thereupon call upon the proponent (if other than staff) to present his or her presentation. Thereafter, the Presiding Officer shall inquire as to whether there are any persons present who desire to address the City Council on the matter. Any person desiring to speak or present evidence shall then make their presence known to the Presiding Officer and, upon being recognized by the Presiding Officer, may speak or present evidence relevant to the subject matter being heard.
5. The applicant/appellant, and/or their representative shall speak first and shall have a sufficient amount of time to do so, any portion of which may be reserved and used for rebuttal.
6. Each member of the public wishing to address the Council, other than the applicant/appellant, shall then be allowed to address the Council and shall have three (3) minutes to speak. Prior to declaring the public hearing open, however, when necessary because of the number of possible speakers, the Presiding Officer may establish a time limit for the entire public hearing, or establish time limits for the presentation of each individual speaker. All persons interested in the matter being heard by the Council shall be entitled to submit written evidence or remarks, as well as other graphic evidence. All such evidence presented shall be retained by the City Clerk as part of the record.
7. Councilmembers who wish to ask questions of the speakers, staff or each other, during the public hearing portion, may do so only after being recognized by the Presiding Officer in the manner set out in this policy.
8. Councilmembers should be mindful that the purpose of the public hearing is to obtain testimony, and not to debate the merits of the item under consideration. Councilmembers should avoid debate and expressions of personal opinion until after the close of the public hearing.
9. Following the conclusion of such questions, the Presiding Officer shall allow the applicant/appellant the opportunity for rebuttal.
10. Following the rebuttal, the Presiding Officer shall close the public hearing and then allow each Councilmember to state his or her opinion on the item before asking for

a motion to decide the matter.

- 11: Upon closing the public hearing by the Presiding Officer, no additional public testimony shall be solicited or received by the Council without reopening the public hearing through the Presiding Officer with consensus of the Council.
12. The Presiding Officer at all times shall conduct the public hearing in such a manner as to afford due process to all affected persons.

XII. MEETING DECORUM & CONDUCT

Meetings of the City Council shall be conducted in an open and orderly manner and in an environment safe for all persons in attendance to ensure that the public has a full opportunity to be heard and that the deliberative process of the Council is retained at all times. The Presiding Officer shall be responsible for maintaining the order and decorum of meetings. This policy is not intended to deprive any person of his or her right to freedom of expression, but only to maintain, to the extent possible and reasonable, a safe and conducive place to conduct public business.

A. Conduct:

1. Members of the audience shall not engage in disorderly or boisterous conduct, including the utterance of obscene, lewd, loud, threatening, repeatedly irrelevant or repetitious, or abusive language; including clapping, whistling, yelling, stamping of the feet, or other acts which disturb, disrupt, impede or otherwise render the orderly conduct of the City Council meeting infeasible. A member of the audience engaging in any such conduct may, after warning by the Presiding Officer, at the discretion of the Presiding Officer or a majority of the City Council, be subject to removal from the meeting.
2. Persons in the audience will refrain from creating, provoking or participating in any type of disturbance involving unwelcome physical contact.
3. Noise emanating from the lobby outside the Council Chambers which is audible within the Chambers shall not be permitted. The Sergeant-at-Arms is authorized to enforce this rule by requesting those in the lobby to remain silent or to leave the area.

B. Authorized & Designated Areas:

1. No person shall stand or sit in the aisles. No person shall block any doorways or exits.

2. No person except City officials shall be permitted within the platform area in front of the Council dais without the prior consent of the Presiding Officer or City Manager.
- C. Signs, Objects or Symbolic Material:
1. Placards, signs, and posters may be brought into the Council Chambers unless such objects disturb, disrupt, impede or otherwise render the orderly conduct of the Council meeting infeasible, or block the view of any other person in attendance, in which case such placard, sign, or poster shall, at the discretion of the Presiding Officer or a majority of the Council, be moved to a different location or removed from the Chambers.
 2. Packages, bundles, suitcases or other large or potentially dangerous objects shall not, without the prior authorization of the Presiding Officer or City Manager, be brought into the City Council Chambers and are subject to search to determine that they do not pose a threat or as otherwise requested by the Sergeant-at-Arms.
- D. Service Animals: Except as otherwise allowed by the City Council, no animals except for service animals shall be brought into the Council Chambers.
- E. Photography/Videography: Photographs, audiotapes and videotapes may be taken from the rear of the Council Chambers or from any seat within the Chambers, as long as such activity does not disrupt or disturb the audience, public speakers, Councilmembers or others on the dais, and interfere with the orderly conduct of the meeting. When a filming area has been designated by the Fire Marshal or Sergeant-at-Arms, filming shall occur in that area only. The Fire Marshal or Sergeant-at-Arms may designate an area for credentialed media only.
- F. Cellular & Electronic Devices: Persons in the audience will refrain from using cellular phones and/or pagers while the City Council meeting is in session.

XIII. ENFORCEMENT

- A. Sergeant-at-Arms: The Chief of Police or his or her designee shall be the ex-officio Sergeant-at-Arms of the City Council. The Sergeant-of-Arms shall carry out all orders and instructions given by the Presiding Officer for the purpose of maintaining order and decorum in the Council Chambers. Any Councilmember may move to require the Presiding Officer to enforce the rules upon affirmative vote of a majority of the Council.
- B. Violations: Upon a violation of the Rules of Procedure and Order established herein, the procedure to enforce the rules are as follows:

1. **Warning:** The Presiding Officer shall first request that a person who is violating the rules cease such conduct. If, after receiving a request from the Presiding Officer, the person persists in violating the rules, the Presiding Officer shall order a recess. The Sergeant-at-Arms is authorized to warn the person that their conduct is violating the rules and that they are requested to cease such conduct. If upon resumption of the meeting the violation persists, the Presiding Officer may order another recess whereupon the Sergeant-at-Arms shall have the authority to order the person removed from the meeting and/or cited in violation of Penal Code Section 403.
2. **Motion to Enforce:** Any Councilmember may call a Point of Order should the City Council fail to abide by the provisions of this policy, whereupon the Council shall immediately act upon the Point of Order by roll call vote. If the Presiding Officer fails to enforce the Rules of Procedure and Order set forth herein, any member of the Council may move to require the Presiding Officer to do so, and an affirmative vote of a majority of the Council shall require the Presiding Officer to do so. If the Presiding Officer fails to carry out the will of the majority of the Council, the majority may designate another member of the Council to act as Presiding Officer for the remainder of the meeting, for the limited purpose of enforcing the rules established herein.
3. **Clearing the Room:** Pursuant to Government Code Section 54957.9, in the event that any meeting is willfully interrupted by a group of persons so as to render the orderly conduct of such meeting unfeasible and order cannot be restored by the removal of the individuals who are willfully interrupting the meeting, the Presiding Officer may order the room cleared and the meeting shall continue in session. Only matters appearing on the agenda may be considered in such a session. Credentialed representatives of the press or other credentialed news media, except those participating in the disturbance, shall be allowed to attend any session held pursuant to Section 54957.9.
4. **Violation of California State Law:** A person or persons who willfully and intentionally impair or impede the conduct of a Council meeting by violating these Rules of Procedure and Order may be prosecuted under California Penal Code §403, California Elections Code Section 18340, or any other applicable State law for disturbing a public meeting.

XIV. PROCEDURAL MATTERS

- A. **City Council Seating Arrangement:** Following each General Election in which new a Councilmember(s) is elected, members of the City Council shall be seated at the Council dais with senior Councilmembers having first choice of seats. The Mayor, however, shall

be seated in the center of the Council dais and the Vice Mayor shall be seated immediately next to and to the left of the Mayor. In the event of equal seniority among members of the Council, selection of Council seats shall be made alphabetically.

- B. Signing of Meeting Documents: The Presiding Officer shall sign all ordinances, resolutions, contracts and other documents necessitating his or her signature which were adopted in his or her presence, unless he or she is unavailable, in which case the signature of the Vice Mayor may be used.
- C. Copy of Recordings: The public may obtain from the City Clerk a copy, at cost, of an existing recording made by the legislative body of its public sessions.
- D. Ceremonial Matters: There are several different types of action the City Council may take to provide recognition or express appreciation:
 - 1. Certifications of Appreciation or Recognition: Commendations are typically issued to acknowledge the activities of a person or organization.
 - 2. Proclamations: Public announcements directing attention to a person, organization, event or cause. Proclamations will be issued subject to the policy described below.
- E. Proclamations: It is the policy of the City Council to issue proclamations for certain individuals, organizations, events or causes, when such a proclamation positively impacts the community and conveys an affirmative message to residents.
 - 1. Discretion should be used in determining whether or not to issue a proclamation. Proclamations that are political in nature, are controversial, or that likely would not enjoy a high level of community interest and support, are discouraged.
 - 2. It is the policy of the City Council to process requests for proclamations in the following manner:
 - a. Requests for proclamations will be made through the Mayor's Office;
 - b. If the Mayor determines that the proclamation request is consistent with the policy stated above, the Mayor will direct his or her staff member to prepare the proclamation and the proclamation will be issued.
 - c. Upon receipt of the draft proclamation language, the Mayor will direct the City Manager to place the item on a meeting agenda depending on the nature and time-sensitivity of the request.

XV. SOCIAL MEDIA

With the ever-growing use of social media, the Council and City staff should be aware that comments, statements, opinions, etc. are still subject to the same restrictions identified in the California Government Code (commonly referred to as the Brown Act and the Public Records Act). While the City of National City strives to maintain community involvement and transparency in its government functions, certain State and local laws must be considered and kept in mind while using social media mediums. Social mediums such as Facebook, Twitter, and others can be viewed by other people including other Councilmembers. Councilmembers are encouraged to check the information they provide for accuracy.

Multiple Councilmembers cannot comment on the same conversation, as that can create a "serial meeting" of the Council and is a direct violation of the Brown Act. If Councilmembers communicate on social media about "city business", as defined in City Administrative Policy No. 02.06, any such communication may be released to the public upon request.

Councilmembers should refrain from stating personal opinions on matters being brought before the Council including, but not limited to: personal opinions on topics, declarations on how an official intends to vote for an item, debating with citizens on items, or presentation of the Councilmember's argument before or against an item, as those could be considered violations of the Brown Act, which can result in criminal and civil liabilities for the official.

Councilmembers should always maintain professionalism and common courtesy in posts and comments when commenting in their official capacity and should remain neutral in postings to prevent the interpretation that a decision has already been made outside of an open meeting, in violation of the Brown Act. Councilmembers should also be aware that there is inherent personal civil liability risk on all comments they make outside of official meetings. For example, if a Councilmember "blocks" a social media user, or deletes a comment from a social media user, the Councilmember risks violating the social media user's First Amendment rights.

Councilmembers should not use their official positions to make negative posts, voice personal opinions, etc. against any individual, business, entity, etc. as that could create negative feedback for the official and City and could potentially subject the official to personal civil liability for slander, defamation of character, or other civil remedies that could be determined by a court.

City Councilmembers and staff shall not use any official City media site, including but not limited to the City's Facebook page, the City's Twitter accounts, or to any other City media outlet for personal reasons or personal gain.

XVI. POLICY INTERPRETATION & APPLICABILITY

The Policy and Rules of Procedure and Order set forth herein shall be liberally construed to effectuate their purpose and no ordinance, resolution, proceeding or other action of the City Council shall be invalidated, nor the legality thereof otherwise affected, by the failure or

omission of the Council to technically comply with, observe, or otherwise follow such rules. Any provision of these rules not already governed by City ordinance or State law may be suspended by a majority vote of the Council.

The rules set forth herein shall apply to all meetings of the City Council subject to the Brown Act and shall apply to the Council Chambers or any other location where a meeting subject to these rules takes place. In the event of any inconsistency between these rules and State law or regulation, State law or regulation shall apply.

XVII. DEFINITIONS

Abstain	To publicly refrain from voting usually because of a conflict of interest.
Adjourn	A privileged motion to officially close a meeting. A second is required and a majority vote is required to adopt it.
Call to Order	An announcement by the Presiding Officer to convene a meeting.
Consent Calendar	The routine parts of the agenda which are approved without discussion or dissent.
Decorum	To conduct oneself in a proper manner.
Dire Emergency	When a majority of the legislative body determines that a dire emergency exists, it may call an emergency meeting (§ 54956.5). A dire emergency is defined as a crippling disaster, mass distribution, terrorist act, or threatened terrorist activity that poses peril so immediate and significant that requiring a legislative body to provide one-hour notice before holding an emergency meeting may endanger the public health, safety, or both.
Emergency Meeting	When a majority of the legislative body determines that an emergency situation exists, it may call an emergency meeting (§ 54956.5). An emergency is defined as a crippling activity, work stoppage or other activity which severely impairs public health, safety or both.
Legislative Body	City Councilmembers are legislators. Together they constitute a legislative body that is given authority by the State constitution and State law to make local law.

Meeting	Includes any congregation of a majority of the members of a legislative body at the same time and place to hear, discuss or deliberate upon any matter which is under the subject matter jurisdiction of the agency. (Government Code § 54952.2(a))
Minutes	The official record of what is done at a meeting.
Motion	The vehicles for decision making by a body used with a vote to indicate approval or denial, adoption or direction.
Ordinance	A city law that generally requires two separate meetings and typically becomes effective thirty days after adoption.
Parliamentarian	One who advises the officers, committees, and members on matters regarding parliamentary procedure.
Policy	The opinions, philosophy, or practices that are adopted by an organization.
Public Hearing	Items that are publicly noticed for a specific Council meeting date, as generally required by law, and are designed to receive separate public input on a specific matter.
Point of Order	An interruption of a meeting to question whether rules or bylaws are being broken, such as the speaker has strayed from the motion currently under consideration.
Presiding Officer	The officer conducting the meeting; Chair or Chairman
Public Hearing	A noticed public session to receive original evidence or testimony on applications regulated by this title. Scheduled public hearings shall be commenced at 6:00 p.m. or as soon thereafter as possible.
Quorum	The minimum number of members who must be present at a meeting to transact business legally.
Ralph M. Brown Act	The Ralph M. Brown Act, commonly known as the "Brown Act", governs meetings conducted by local legislative bodies, such as boards of supervisors, city councils and school boards. The Act represents the Legislature's determination of how the balance should be struck between public access to meetings of multi-member public bodies on the one hand and the need for confidential candor, debate, and information gathering on the

other. The purpose of the Brown Act is to facilitate public participation in local government decisions and to curb misuse of the democratic process by secret legislation by public bodies.

Recess	A period of time longer than thirteen (13) days without a regular or special meeting of the Council.
Resolution	Represents a legislative or other type of action providing for the disposition of a particular item of business. Resolutions take effect upon passage by a majority vote of the Council unless other law imposes a later effective date.
Rosenberg's Rules of Order	Written rules of parliamentary procedure which govern a meeting.
Sergeant-at-Arms	The Chief of Police or his or her designee shall be the ex-officio Sergeant-at-Arms of the City Council.
Special Meeting	In contrast with a regular meeting, a meeting called for a particular purpose that is stated when the meeting is called.
